The past year 2022 became another year of trials and victories for the Russian people. Responding to the challenges of the time, on November 9, 2022, President of the Russian Federation V. V. Putin signed Decree No. 809 “On approval of the Fundamentals of State Policy for the Preservation and Strengthening of Traditional Russian Spiritual and Moral Values”. According to article 19 of this Decree, the solution of the tasks of preservation and strengthening traditional Russian spiritual and moral values shall be carried out, among other things, by increasing the efficiency of the activities of scientific, educational, awareness-raising, and cultural organizations in protecting historical truth, preserving historical memory, countering the falsification of history.

This mission is fully met by the activities of the Presidential Library in the past year to fulfill the planned scope of work, and first of all the State assignment No. 303-00065-22-00 for 2022 and for the planning period of 2023 and 2024, approved by the head of the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation – a state body acting as the founder of the Presidential Library.

In 2022, the implementation of the Strategy of Development of the Presidential Library for the Period up to 2030, approved by the founder, began. We have to go through the next stage of the planned path, updating all areas of activity – from the acquisition and disclosure of holdings to technological processes. The task was set to increase the demand for our holdings among various user groups in Russia and abroad, new services appear to solve it (for example, the round-the-clock television channel of the Presidential Library began its work), the circle of partners of the institution is expanding, including government bodies and corporations, organizations of culture, science, education also from friendly countries as well.

In the interests of the state and for the benefit of society, we are moving forward together with the country, overcoming all difficulties, and the experience, professionalism, knowledge, and creativity we have accumulated remain the key to the successful completion of tasks of any complexity.

We thank all readers and partners for their attention and cooperation!

PROJECTS OF THE YEAR

350th Birth Anniversary of Peter the Great

For several years, the Presidential Library actively participated in the preparations for the celebration of the 350th birth anniversary of Peter I, announced by the Decree of the President of the Russian Federation dated October 25, 2018, No. 609, and in the anniversary year 2022 held a series of significant commemorative events.

➔ **“Creator of the Russian Welfare...”** – an exhibition created on the basis of the Presidential Library’s collection to reflect the scale of political, cultural, and economical reforms carried out by Peter I. The exposition features documents and books of 18th–19th centuries on the history of creation of the navy and regular army, events of the Great Northern War, reforms in the sphere of state administration. By the example of such monuments as “Civil Primer Book with Moralizing”, “Honest Mirror of Youth”, and a number of laws it is possible to trace how the way of life of Russian society changed. Rare images of historical places related to Peter I became available to the wide range of users both in digital and printed form.



➔ **“Peter the Great Introduced Sciences to Us...”** is an exhibition reflecting the Emperor’s contribution to the development of Russian science and scientific education; it was launched in cooperation with St. Petersburg State University, a member of the Assembly of Peter’s Museums in Russia. The Emperor’s decree on the establishment of the Academy of Sciences, a university and a gymnasium, examples of the development of domestic book printing, facts about the activities of first academicians, the main works of the outstanding figure of Russian science M. V. Lomonosov are presented.

➔ **“Keepers of the Law: Marking the 300th Anniversary of the Establishment of the Prosecutor’s Office of Russia”** – an exhibition project revealing the history of establishment and formation of the Prosecutor’s Office of the Russian Empire, activities of the Prosecutor Generals of the Senate in 1722–1802 and the Ministers of Justice, who were Prosecutor Generals in 1802–1917; the project was prepared in collaboration with the Russian State Historical Archive, the Library of the Russian Academy of Sciences, the Gorky Scientific Library of St. Petersburg State University,





the Central Naval Library. The exposition features historical documents, rare books, newspapers, and photographs.

➔ **“Library of Peter I”** – a digital exhibition freely available on the Presidential Library’s website prepared within the scope of a joint project with the Library of the Russian Academy of Sciences aimed at scanning unique pieces from the Emperor’s collection of manuscripts, books, maps, drafts, and drawings.

➔ **“Peter’s Petersburg – the Economic Centre of the Russian State”** – an electronic exhibition available on the St. Petersburg stand at the venue of the XXV St. Petersburg International Economic Forum. On the map of St. Petersburg of the 18th century, objects of the time of Peter the Great were marked, which were associated with the economic reforms of the Emperor. By example of rare documents from the electronic holdings of the Presidential Library, guests of the forum could learn how trade, industry, and production developed in the city since 1703 and how the economic activity of the Russian state was managed.

➔ **“Peter I – the Creator of the Regular Russian Navy”** – a digital exhibition based on materials from the digital holdings of the Presidential Library: rare publications, archive documents, ancient drawings and other, dedicated to the establishment of the fleet and the role of the Emperor in the formation of the Russian shipbuilding. Exhibition visitors learned how young Peter’s interest in navigation and shipbuilding was born, what a “funny” flotilla was, and where building ships for the Russian fleet first started. Part of the exposition told about the first sea military campaigns, as well as about the victories of Russian sailors in the Northern War. Separately, the history of the founding of St. Petersburg and Kronshtadt and the laying of the Admiralty were presented.



➤ **“International Relations of Russia in the Era of Peter the Great. Marking the 350th Birth Anniversary of the Russian Emperor Peter I”** – the international scientific conference organized and held in collaboration with the Institute of Oriental Manuscripts of the Russian Academy of Sciences, attended by researchers from leading scientific institutes, universities, archives, and libraries of Russia, as well as scientists from other countries (Germany, Italy, France, and Turkey) to discuss the history of Russia’s international relations with the countries of the West and East during the reign of Peter the Great.

➤ The work continued on the development of a unique information project **“World War II in Archival Documents (Digitized Archival Documents, Film and Photo Materials)”**, which is published on the Presidential Library’s website. The organizers of the project are the Rosarchiv, the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation, and the Presidential Library, in accordance with the implementation of the Address of the President of Russian Federation to the Federal Assembly on January 15, 2020.



300th Anniversary of the Establishment of the Herald's College and 30th Anniversary of the Recreation of the Heraldic Council of Russia

➔ The exhibition “**Heraldic Art**”, which was prepared under the patronage of the Heraldic Council under the President of the Russian Federation and launched in exhibition halls of the Presidential Library, was timed to coincide with the 300th anniversary of the creation of the Herald's College by Peter the Great and the 30th anniversary of the recreation of the Heraldic Service in the Russian Federation. Works of ten contemporary Russian heraldic artists, projects of the State Emblem of the Russian Federation, made in 1992–1993 by the People's Artist of Russia E. I. Ukhnaiev were presented. For almost a century, the state heraldic department existed in the structure of the Governing Senate and was located there from the moment the complex of buildings of the Senate and the Synod was built in 1835 and until the early 1920s.

➔ **Protocol of Intent between the Heraldic Council under the President of the Russian Federation and the Presidential Library** was signed within the framework of the XXV St. Petersburg International Economic Forum. The parties agreed to establish and develop cooperation in order to preserve and popularize documents on the history, theory, and practice of the Russian statehood, state symbols of the Russian Federation, and national heraldic heritage.



Development of Interlibrary Cooperation

A preliminary agreement on the creation of the **Association of the Presidential Libraries** was reached in 2022 between the presidential libraries of four countries: Azerbaijan, Belarus, Kazakhstan, and Russia.



As the head of the Department of Information and Communication Technologies of the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation S. L. Grinevich noted, the Association will facilitate the exchange of experience in the field of information and analytical support for public authorities, the exchange of resources on issues of history, law, economics, politics, cultural interaction, implementation of advanced achievements, and new technologies. Such an organization is being created for the first time and will have an international status.

The first to sign the protocol of intent to create the Association of the Presidential Libraries were the Director General of the Presidential Library Yuri Stanislavovich Nosov and the Director of the Library of the First President of the Republic of Kazakhstan Temirbolat Bakytzhan Berikbayuly.

As part of the work of the Association, it is planned to hold joint events such as round tables, conferences, meetings. One of the important goals is to provide wide access to world cultural values.

Informational Support of the Federative Development of Russia

The signing by the President of the Russian Federation of four Federal Constitutional Laws on the admission of the Donetsk and Luhansk People's Republics, the Zaporozhye region, and the Kherson region into the Russian Federation, the formation of new corresponding territories of the Russian Federation (No. 5-FCL, 6-FCL, 7-FCL, 8-FCL dated October 4, 2022), the conduction of a special military operation by the Russian Armed Forces could not but be reflected in the activities of the Presidential Library in 2022.

➔ **“Donbass-2022”** – a frontline photo exhibition arranged in cooperation with “Rossiyskaya Gazeta” featured works of the military photo correspondent Vladimir Anosov, who captured events in Mariupol, Donetsk, Volnovakha, Lisichansk, Luhansk, and other cities, which are now Russian.



➔ **“The Hero’s Wife”** is an exhibition of portraits of women whose husbands devoted their lives to military service to the Motherland. The organizers of the exhibition – the Presidential Library, the Foundation for Social Initiatives “Peaceful People”, the public organization “Residents of Besieged Leningrad” with the support of the Public Chamber of St. Petersburg – presented 50 photo stories about the best spiritual qualities of Russian women, their beauty, faith, resilience, and dedication. The wives of Russian servicemen were photographed in the jackets of their spouses, including those who,



unfortunately, had not returned from the battle. The photo album, which became the basis of the exposition, was highly appreciated by the President of the Russian Federation Vladimir Putin.

➔ As a chairman of the Academic Board of the Presidential Library Director General Yu. S. Nosov made a report on **“Information Support for the Activities of State Bodies of the Russian Federation by Institutions of Culture,**

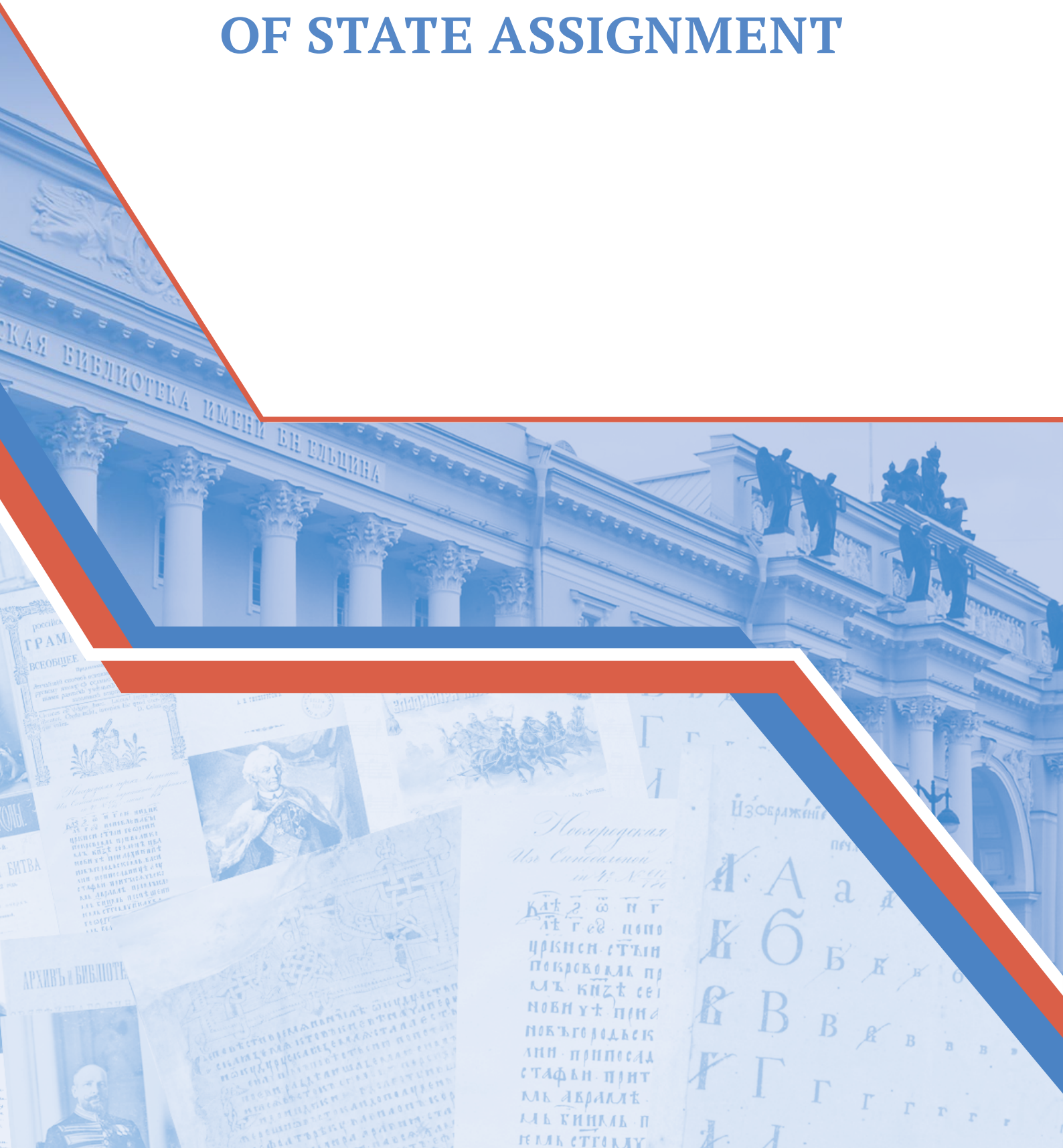
Science, Education: Approaches and Practices” for attendees of the 21st meeting of the Board. At the meeting, organizations linked by strategic partnership with the Presidential Library exchanged experience in information support for the current state agenda, which is approved by federal laws, decrees of the President of the Russian Federation, and strategic planning documents. The participants of the discussion included the Commander-in-Chief of the Navy of Russia in 2012–2016, chairman of the regional public organization “Admirals Club” in St. Petersburg V. V. Chirkov,



Director of the Russian State Archives of the Navy V. G. Smirnov, Director of the Russian State Historical Archive S. V. Shtukova, First Vice-Rector, Chairman of the Academic Council of the University of Moscow State University – BIT in Shenzhen (People’s Republic of China) S. M. Shakhrai, Rector of St. Petersburg State Institute of Culture A. S. Turgaev, Director of the Fundamental Library of Herzen State Pedagogical University of Russia N. N. Kvelidze-Kuznetsova, Director General of the Russian National Library V. G. Gronsky, Deputy Director General for Research and Publishing Activities of the Russian State Library A. Yu. Samarin, Director General of the State Public Historical Library of Russia M. D. Afanasiev, President of the Russian Library Association, Head of the Service “Virtual Russian Museum” of the State Russian Museum M. Yu. Gladkikh.

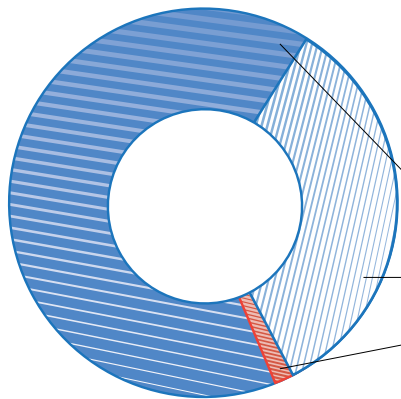
Developing the Central Holding of Digital Documents

In 2022, 48 fund-holding organizations took part in the formation of the Presidential Library's holdings, including the State Archive of the Russian Federation, the Russian State Historical Archive, the Russian State Library, the Central Naval Library, the Military History Library of the General Staff of the Ministry of Defense of the Russian Federation, the M. Gorky Scientific Library of St. Petersburg State University, as well as the Samara Regional Universal Scientific Library, the Murmansk State Universal Scientific Library, the Arkhangelsk Regional Scientific Library, the A. S. Popov Central Museum of Communications, the N. G. Kuznetsov Naval Academy, the Alupka Palace and Park Museum-Reserve, etc.

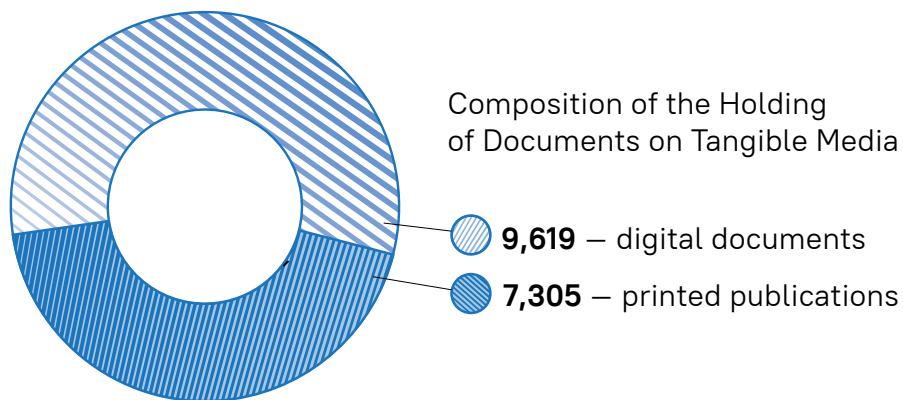


Structure of acquisitions into the Central Holding of Digital Documents in 2022 in terms of depository volume

Developing of Holding of Documents on Tangible Media

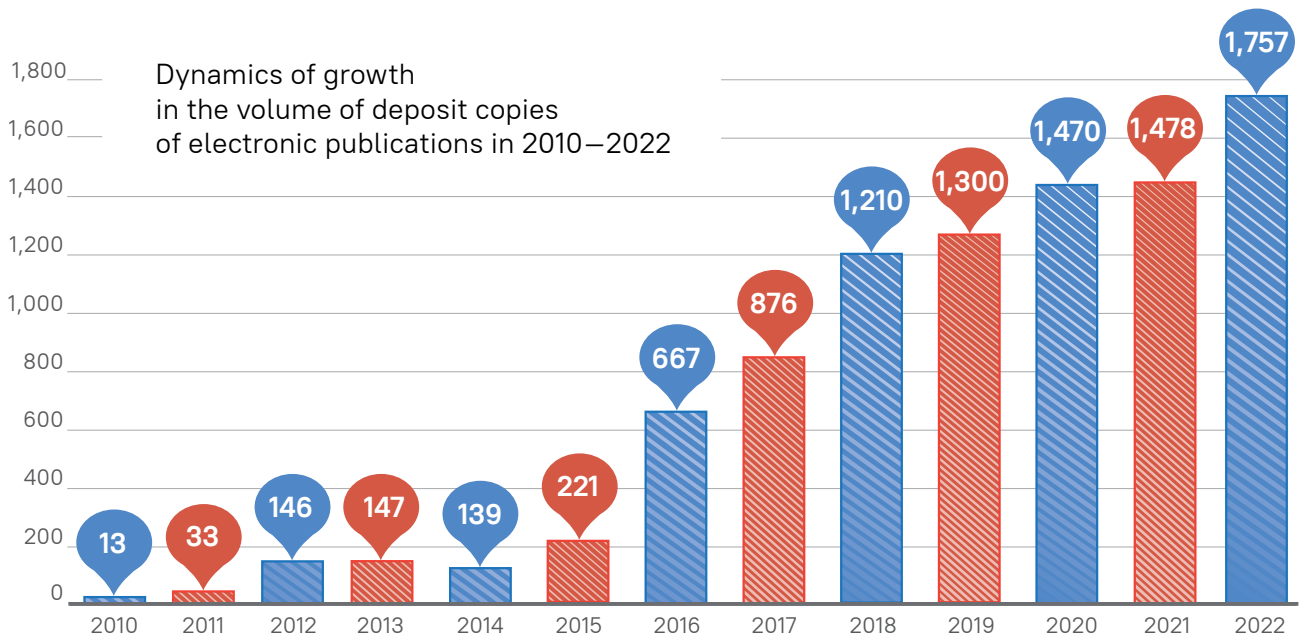


As of December 31, 2022, total amount of the Holding of Documents on Tangible Media amounted to **16,924** copies. Throughout the year, the holding was replenished with **1,933** depository units.

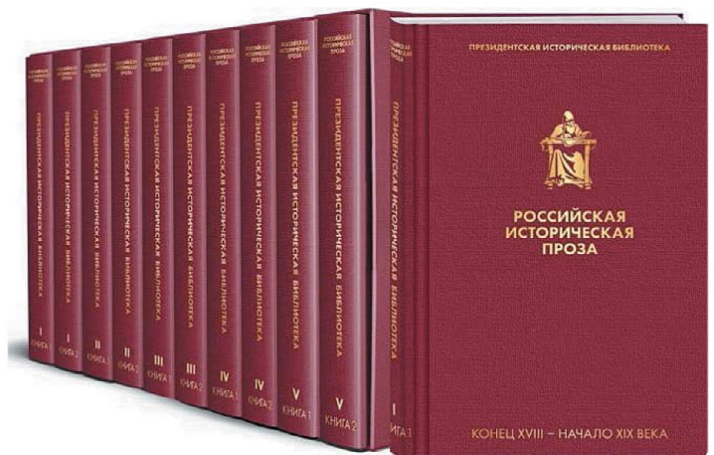
1,757 copies of digital publications were submitted to the Presidential Library in 2022 for storage under the Federal Law No. 77-FL “On Deposit Copies of Documents”. As a tradition, the major part of the acquisitions consists of materials of scientific conferences and digital teaching aids.

Deposit copies were provided by **89** document producers, including leading universities of the country, research institutes, scientific centers, and libraries: the Kostroma State University, the Orenburg State University, the Samara National Research University named after Academician S. P. Korolev, the Smolensk State University, the Southern Federal University, All-Russian Research Geological Institute named after A. P. Karpinsky, the Karelian Scientific Center of the Russian Academy of Sciences, the International Center for Scientific research projects, the Pskov Regional Universal Scientific Library, etc.

The replenishment of the holding of documents with printed publications on tangible media on a gratuitous basis continued. Among the donors were both individuals and organizations – libraries, universities, publishing houses. Of the **163** items received, **133** were books.



The publication of “Russian Historical Prose” in five volumes (ten books), which combined historical novels and stories of the late 18th – early 21st centuries on its pages was a significant gift. This series continues the project “Presidential Historical Library”, which is being developed by experts from the country’s leading scientific and cultural organizations under the auspices of the Russian Historical Society.



The following was among the most interesting acquisitions:

➔ **Album “Prokudin-Gorsky. Central Russia”** (Moscow, 2021) dedicated to the work of the scientist and pioneer photo artist S. M. Prokudin-Gorsky, which includes more than 100 historical color photographs of the preserved objects



of the cultural heritage of Central Russia at the beginning of the 20th century, modern photographs of the same objects.



➤ **“The Life of the Apostle Andrew the First-Called: Front Manuscript of the Russian National Library of the Society of Lovers of Ancient Writing F.137”** (Moscow, 2021) – it’s a publication of a unique literary monument, the front life of the Apostle Andrew the First-Called from a handwritten collection created at the turn of the 17th–18th centuries, which consists

of a facsimile reproduction of the front manuscript containing 80 miniatures, as well as a Church Slavonic text with a translation into Russian and comments.

➤ **“Historical and Cultural Heritage of the Komi Republic”** (Syktyvkar, 2021) – the first comprehensive popular science publication dedicated to the 100th anniversary of the formation of the Komi Republic.

➤ **“Gone to Immortality: In Memory of the 2nd Shock Army”** (Moscow, 2021) – the book is dedicated to the feat of arms and the tragedy of the military unit that took part in breaking the siege of Leningrad, fighting on the Volkhov front.

➤ **“Military Police of Russia: History and Modernity”** (Moscow, 2021) – a military-historical work, which, based on archival sources and scientific literature, explores the experience of the formation and development of law enforcement agencies of the military department of the Moscow State, the Russian Empire, the Soviet Union, and the Russian Federation, starting from the 17th century to the present.

In 2022, work on studying and description of materials of the collection of rare books kept in custody of the Presidential Library, revealing publications which have features of book monuments was continued. 47 publications from the Library’s collection of rare books were recognized as book monuments by the resolution of the Expert Council for Book Monuments (see Appendix 1).

Throughout the year, documents from the holding (203 depository units) were displayed at exhibitions organized by the Presidential Library, such as “Discovering Russia with the Presidential Library: To the Anniversaries of Moscow, Murom, Kursk, Totma, Vologda, Veliky Ustyug, Kostroma, Sergiev Posad”, “Creator of the Russian Welfare...”, “Keepers of the Law: Marking the 300th Anniversary of the Establishment of the Prosecutor’s Office of Russia”, “Viktor Matorin. Images of Russian History in Painting. 21st Century”.

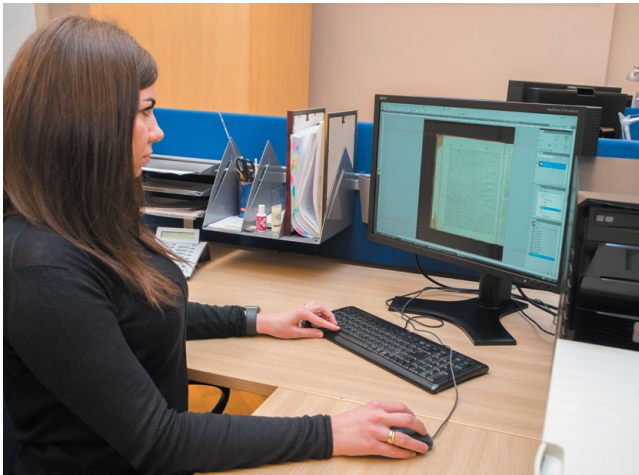
Ensuring of Preservation and Safety of the Library's Holdings: Information Systems and Technologies

In 2022, the Presidential Library continued technological development to solve a set of tasks for managing the activities of the institution, forming and supporting library collections, creating multimedia content, servicing readers and event participants, providing access to various types of documents, including through a network of centers for remote access to information resources of the Library, a complex of multimedia rooms, as well as through the Internet.

Technological processes for creating digital content, forming the digital holdings, processing and storing large arrays of digital data, including on tape media with increased density and in cloud storage, are ensured by the Data Processing Center (DPC) of the Presidential Library. Electronic storage is a collection of modernized data storage systems consisting of disk arrays and tape libraries and implemented in a disaster-proof architecture with geographically separated DPCs.

The process of scanning documents of various formats, from microfilms to large-format maps and atlases (including A1+ and A0+ formats), from various source media is supported with the digital content preparation system equipped with the necessary set of specialized scanners. In 2022, the use of mobile scanning kits to implement digitization of rare documents in close proximity to the holdings was continued.





At the sites of the Russian Geographical Society, digitization of manuscripts of works of members of the Society, archive documents, and maps of the Russian Empire was carried out.

In the walls of the Military Historical Museum of Artillery, Engineers, and Signal Corps, works on digitization of archive documents of the Pushkar Order (1628–1700) were finished.

Implementation of the joint project with the Library of the Russian Academy of Sciences completed on digitization of maps of Peter's epoch finished.

The Presidential Library is not only the first national digital library of Russia, but also a multimedia multifunctional cultural-educational, scientific-educational, and information-analytic centre.

The modernized multimedia technological complex ensures the creation of multimedia content, including filming, processing, editing, storage and prompt transmission of video content to the Internet and social networks using high-definition television standards. The videoconferencing complex ensures gathering multiple remote participants of forums, conferences, webinars, seminars, cinema clubs, and meetings in one session.

The technical equipment of the multifunctional multimedia complex, large conference hall and meeting halls, along with the system of image projection, and the interactive conference system with a televoting facility allow for holding events of any format. The simultaneous interpreting, live broadcasting, wired conference systems, as well as wide capabilities of the modernized complex of videoconferencing ensure the required quality of execution of high-profile events (meetings of chief executives of states, bank, economic, legal, cultural forums, etc.).

The development of information systems and the modernization of software and hardware systems are under the direct control of the state body acting as the founder

of the Presidential Library – the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation.

In 2022, the total volume of data storage systems of the Main Library Center in St. Petersburg was increased to 19 PB (disk storage capacity of 1,000 TB and 18,000 TB, mounted capacity of the TS3500 tape library equipped with LTO-8 drives). The total volume of data storage systems of the Reserve Library Center in Moscow was also expanded to 19 PB (disk storage capacity of 1,000 TB and 18,000 TB, mounted capacity of the TS3500 tape library equipped with LTO-8 drives).

In 2022, in the Reserve Library Center in Moscow, modern high-performance refrigerating machines of the DPC cooling system were put into operation, which created the required conditions for further modernization of the DPC.

The introduction of a new generation video subsystem ensured the modernization of the system for preparing, storing, and distributing television information, which ensures joint work with the Office of the Press Service and Information of the President of the Russian Federation.

A program is being implemented in the institution to introduce system software from the Unified Register of Russian Programs as part of the implementation of the task of technological independence of the Presidential Library's IT solutions.





BIBLIOGRAPHIC PROCESSING OF DOCUMENTS AND CREATION OF CATALOGUES

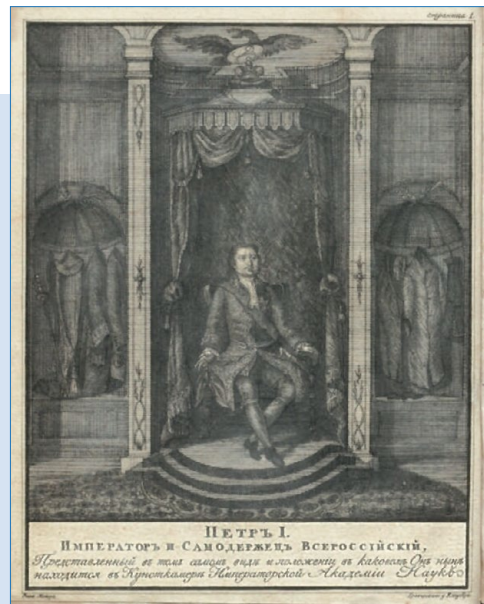

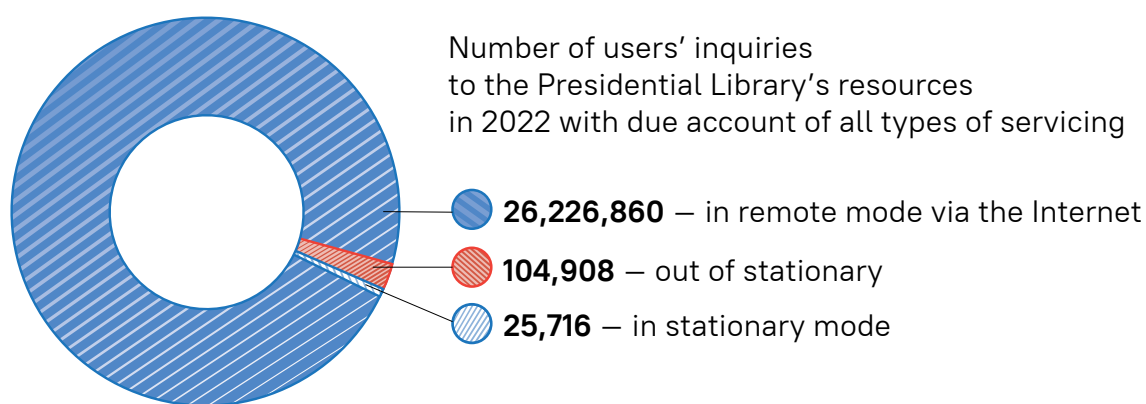

PROVISION OF LIBRARY, BIBLIOGRAPHIC, AND INFORMATION SERVICES TO THE LIBRARY'S USERS

Types of library and information services for users of the Presidential Library differ in terms of the level of accessibility of the documentary holdings, the services provided.



Stationary servicing is conducted at the Main Library Center in St. Petersburg, the Representative Center in Moscow (Reserve Center), and in the Tyumen Branch. There users can not only acquaint with rare handwritten, printed, map and graphic materials, audio, visual and multimedia products from the Central Holding of Digital Documents, but also get various types of library and information services, take part in cultural and awareness-raising and educational events.

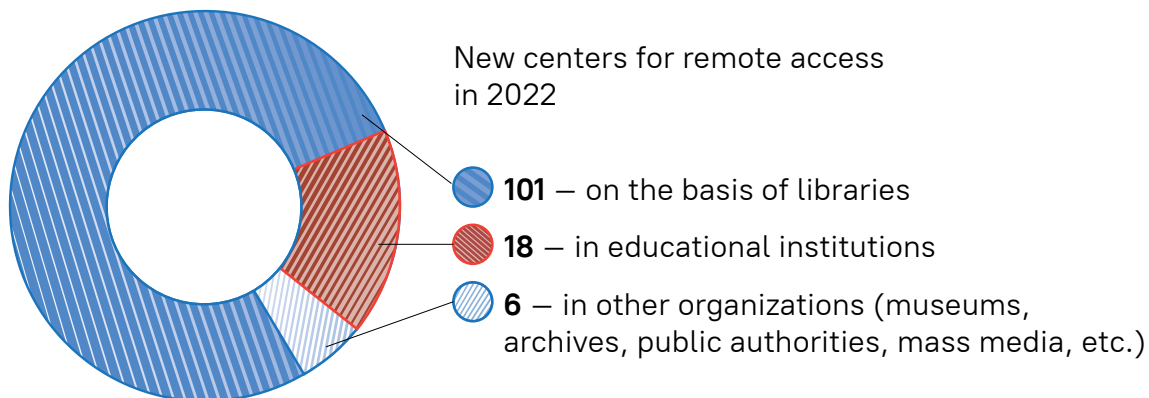
In 2022, at stationary venues **4,122** information services were provided, including:

- ➔ **2,481** individual in-person consultation;
- ➔ **209** thematic consultations (on history, including history of Russian regions, genealogy, jurisprudence, geography, political studies, economics, religion studies, linguistics, etc.);
- ➔ **1,435** responses to information and reference and bibliographic inquiries received through various communication channels.

In order to provide information support for events for readers and visitors of the Library, **15** thematic, **20** interactive and **357** overview presentations were prepared and held for more than **7 thousand** guests (**7,090** people).

As part of research workshops for students of St. Petersburg State University, St. Petersburg University of the Ministry of Internal Affairs of Russia and participants in the Heritage Youth Forum of the Higher School of Economics (St. Petersburg Branch), **12** master classes were held on search for documents in the library collection.

Remote servicing of users is ensured by centers for remote access to the Presidential Library’s digital holdings in Russian regions and abroad. The network of such centers continued its active development.



New centers for remote access to the Presidential Library’s resources include:

- ➔ 8 model municipal libraries opened within the framework of the federal project “Cultural Environment” of the national project “Culture”;
- ➔ Krasnodar Regional Universal Scientific Library named after A. S. Pushkin;
- ➔ Penza Regional Library for Children and Youth;
- ➔ Kuzbass Museum-Reserve “Tomskaya Pisanitsa”;
- ➔ Research and Design Institute of the General Plan of the City of Moscow;
- ➔ 4 sites of the National Research University “Higher School of Economics”.

Within the framework of the program for the development of centers for remote access within constituent territories of the Russian Federation, 10 access centers were connected in the Altai Territory, 8 in the Novosibirsk Region, 7 in the Republic of Bashkortostan, 10 in the Khanty-Mansijsk Autonomous District, and 9 in the Chelyabinsk Region.

In 2022 **2** access centers opened abroad – in the Arab Republic of Egypt on the basis of the Russian House in Cairo and in the Syrian Arab Republic on the basis of the Russian House in Damascus.

In partnership with the Presidential Library, based on the agreements concluded with the administrations of constituent entities of the Russian Federation, joint projects



and events of a cultural, educational, informational and awareness-raising nature are being implemented in the regions of Russia. Handwritten, printed, cartographic and visual materials available in electronic form, supplemented by audiovisual and multimedia products, become the basis for partners to conduct their own events, such as virtual exhibitions and quizzes, intellectual games, video reviews, competitions, video lessons, and many others.

As of December 31, 2022, the total number of centers for remote access to the resources of the Presidential Library were **1,525**, including **48** abroad.

Staff of regional and foreign centers for remote access were provided by the Presidential Library's employees with **2,900** remote services of methodic consulting on search and functional opportunities of remote electronic reading rooms, including in the form of training video clips and video recordings of information and methodic webinars




disclosing thematic and type-specific diversity of the Presidential Library's resources and dedicated to memorable events and historical figures.

In order to further inform users about the materials stored in the Presidential Library, **4** thematic webinars were prepared: “Russo-Turkish War of 1877–1878”; “International Polar Year: Origin, Expeditions, Results”, “Letters of Russian Traveler”, and “Let’s Take the Calendar!”: Role of Calendars in Everyday Life of Russian People”.

Remote user servicing via the Internet, in comparison with the established indicators of the State Assignment in 2022, increased by 300% due not only to the constantly growing number of visits to the www.prlib.ru Internet portal, but also to the increased demand for official information Internet resources of the President and the Government of the Russian Federation, moderated by the Presidential Library.

In 2022, the number of requests from remote users to the information resources of the Presidential Library through the website increased by 20% and amounted to **4,912,577** requests. This includes **2,648,407** hits to pages for viewing electronic documents from the Central Holding of digital documents, as well as **1,793,454** hits to the website pages that provide an opportunity to use information services.

 In 2022, users of the electronic reading room, remote access centers, and the website of the Presidential Library viewed over **2,912,000** digital images of documents.

Remote users paid special interest to such sections of the website as “On This Day” (**876,000** hits) and “Collections” (**723,000** hits). In total, visitors to the website have access to hundreds of digital collections of electronic documents (thematic, regional and person studies, etc.). In 2022, **16** digital collections were added to this list (see Appendix 2).

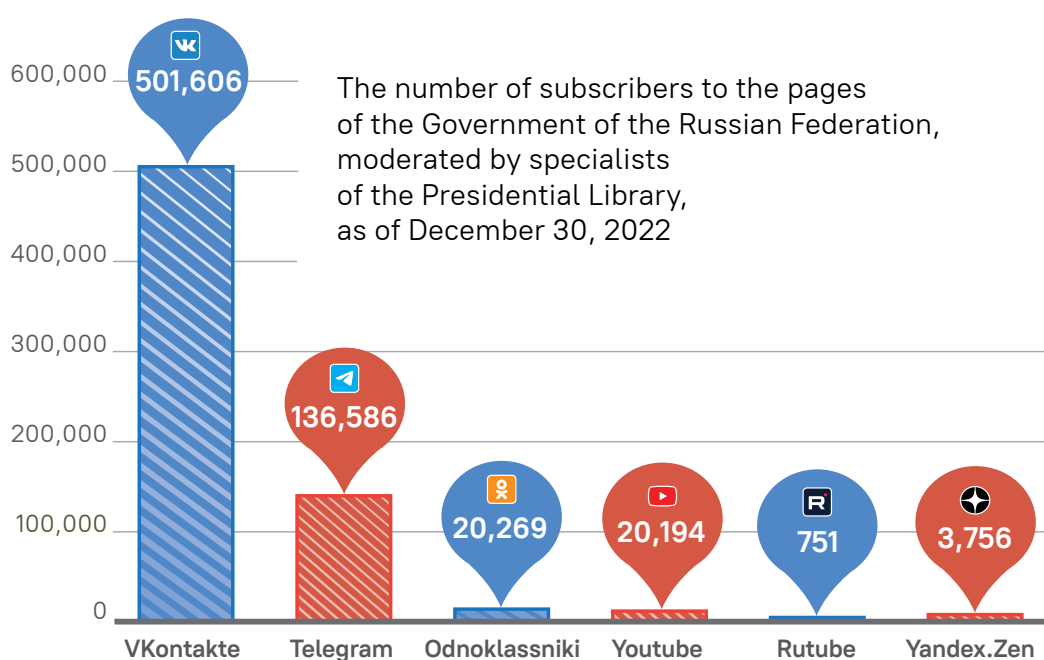
INFORMATION AND ANALYTIC SERVICING OF PUBLIC AUTHORITIES OF THE RUSSIAN FEDERATION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF AFFAIRS OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE RUSSIAN FEDERATION

Information and analytic servicing of public authorities of the Russian Federation and the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation is referred to the main activities of the institution by the Presidential Library’s Charter. It also includes remote servicing of users via the Internet.

In 2022, the following materials were prepared and posted on the official website of the President of the Russian Federation:



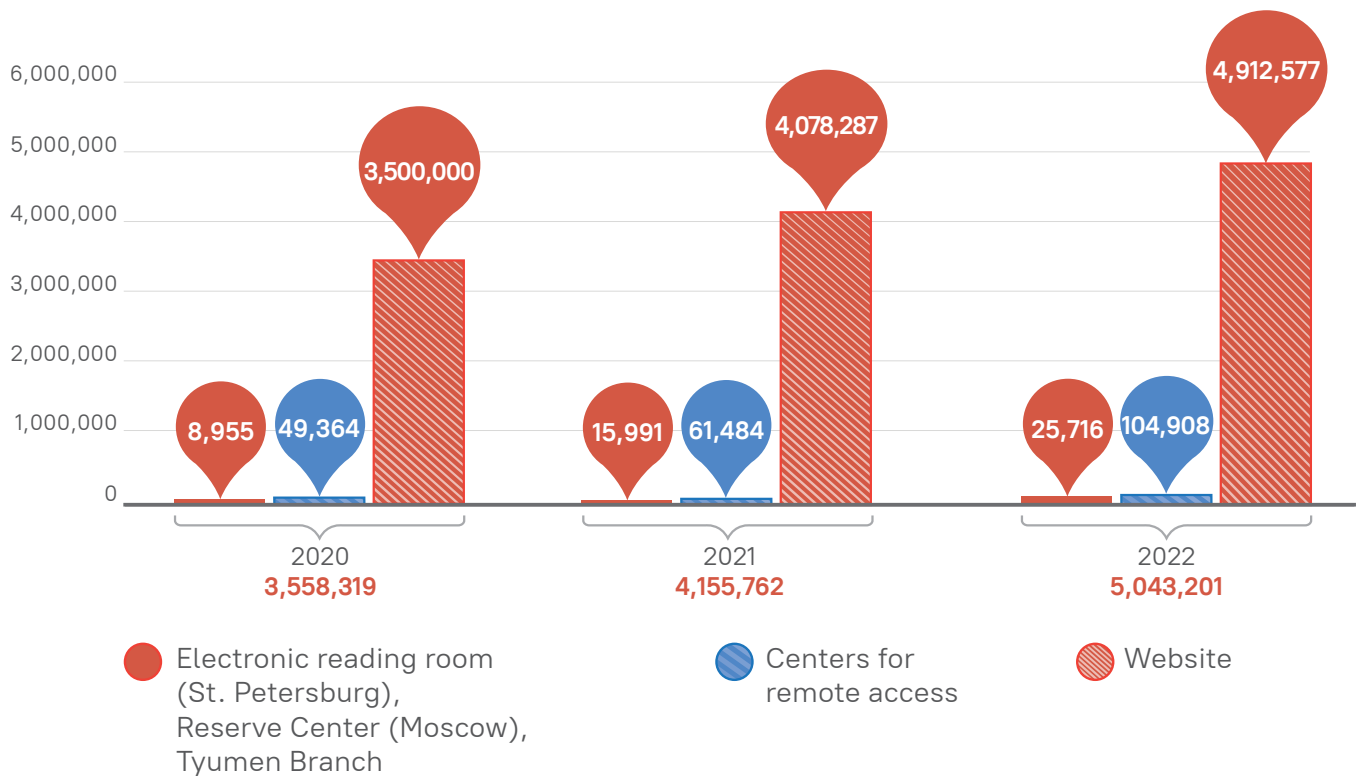

- **245** video and **237** audio recordings of speeches and events attended by the President of the Russian Federation.



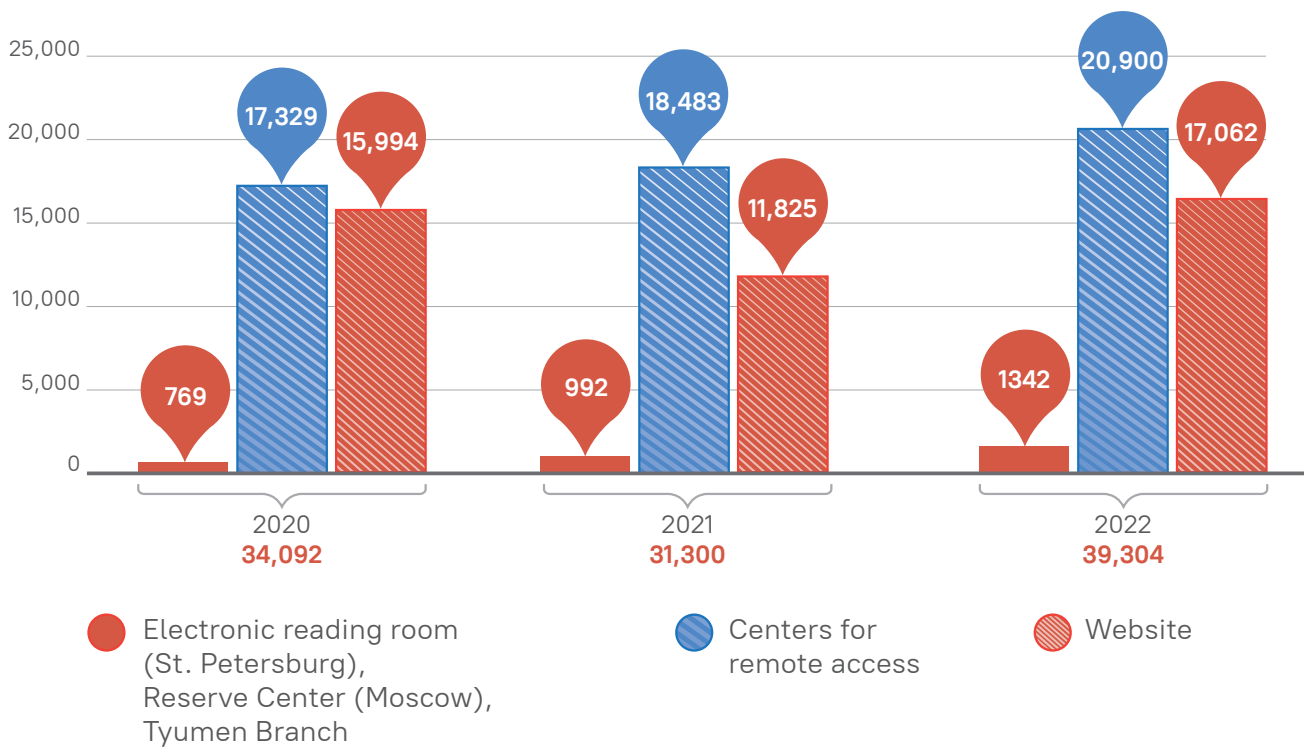
Moderation, collection, analysis, and systematization of opinions and suggestions of Russian and foreign citizens on topical issues of social life, political events, social and economic problems continued.

Total number of visitors for 2022 is **38,483,592**.**

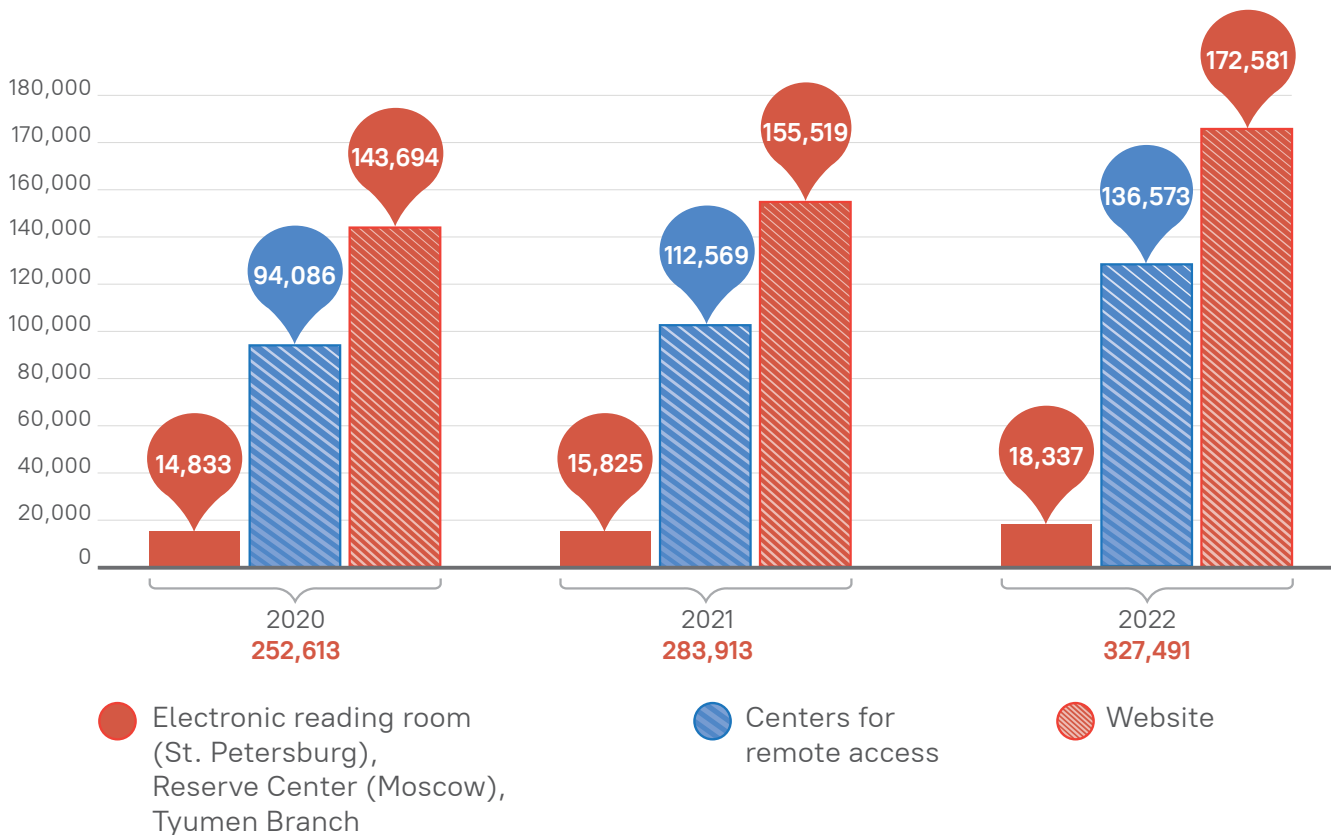
Number of user requests to the Presidential Library's resources in stationary, out-stationary, and remote modes in 2020–2022

ORGANIZATION AND HOLDING OF EVENTS IN THE RUSSIAN FEDERATION

684 events were organized and held within the framework of the State Assignment, which exceeded the planned values by 69 %, mainly due to an increase in the number of excursions that were held at additional requests from educational organizations to participate in a multimedia lesson prepared for the 350th birth anniversary of Peter the Great.

Exhibition Projects

In addition to the exhibition projects included in the “Projects of the Year” section, the following expositions were deployed in the halls and on the website of the Presidential Library.

➔ **“In the Footsteps of Georgy Sedov’s Expeditions to the North Pole”** (February – March, 2022) – a digital exhibition timed to coincide with two memorable dates related to G. Ya. Sedov at once: the 145th anniversary of the birth of Georgy Sedov, and the 110th anniversary of the departure of the Sedov expedition on the ship “Svyatoy Foka” from Arkhangelsk to the North Pole. The exposition was co-organized by “Rossiyskaya Gazeta” and the Northern Maritime Museum (Arkhangelsk). For the first time, the exhibition



presented unique evidence of the expedition: color photographic slides by Nikolai Pinegin, an artist and writer who took part in the polar journey. The photographs, which were taken by “Rossiyskaya Gazeta” correspondents during their travel in the footsteps of Sedov’s expedition, as well as to places associated with its work on Novaya Zemlya, were on display, too.

➔ **“Women of Komi in Russian Science”** (March, 2022) – a digital exhibition dedicated to women scientists of the Republic of Komi who have made a significant contribution to the development of modern science; it was prepared in collaboration with the National Library of the Republic of Komi especially for the International Women’s Day. Guests of the Presidential Library could get acquainted with works of Doctors Philosophy in various fields – geology, pedagogy, biology, philology, history, and economics.

➔ **“Leningrad Pediatric Medical Institute During the Siege. Saving Children: Honor and Courage of Leningrad Pediatricians”** (April – May, 2022) – a digital multimedia exhibition dedicated to the feat of medical workers of the Leningrad Pediatric Medical Institute in the extreme conditions of the siege. Rare photographs, statistical data, memoirs of employees – evidence of the daily selfless work of doctors, nurses – were provided by the St. Petersburg State Medical Pediatric University of the Ministry of Public Health of the Russian Federation.

➔ **“Ensemble of Buildings of the Senate and the Synod”** is an online project placed on the website of the Presidential Library on May 27, 2022, on the All-Russian Day of Libraries and another anniversary of the Presidential Library’s opening. It introduces



the main stages in the development of the center of St. Petersburg, the history of the creation of the ensemble of buildings of the Senate and the Synod and the activities of institutions located here at different times, as well as the processes of restoration and reconstruction of the Synod building in 2007–2009, its adaptation to the needs of the first electronic national library.

➔ **“The Age of the ‘Siberian Lights’”** (April – May, 2022) – a digital exhibition timed to coincide with the 100th anniversary of one of the oldest literary periodicals in Russia, which was prepared by employees of the Novosibirsk State Regional Scientific Library, where a regional center of the Presidential Library operates, in cooperation with the editorial house of the “Siberian Lights” magazine. The history of the periodical reflects the process of development of the Russian and Siberian in particular literature from early 1920s up to the present days.

➔ **“With His Labor He Revealed Russia in Color, and More than All the Kings He Became Famous in the World”** (June – July, 2022) – an art exhibition of pictorial and graphic, with elements of architectural modeling, works of students of the architectural department of the St. Petersburg College of Architecture and Civil Engineering, dedicated to the 350th birth anniversary of Peter the Great.

➔ **“Presidential Library: History and Modernity”** – a permanent exposition opened in the Library’s halls on September 12, 2022. Here visitors can learn about the history of the creation of the Presidential Library, the directions and features





of the institution's activities. The exhibits are presented simultaneously in traditional and digital formats. Visitors to the exhibition can see official documents on the preparation and opening of the Presidential Library, interaction with the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation, which is in charge of the Library, photographs, publications based on the electronic collection of the Library, books, collections, and publications of employees, gifts from partners and libraries, etc. The plasma panel in the hall presents promotional videos that reveal various aspects of the institution's activities: from the formation of a national electronic resource, which implies preserving digital copies of the most important documents on the history, theory and practice of the Russian statehood, the Russian language, to holding events, including those at the state level.



➔ **“Discovering Russia with the Presidential Library”** (September – October, 2022) is a new annual exhibition project aimed at showing the original character of Russian cities and regions, to acquaint with their history, famous natives, historical monuments and other sights. In 2022, the heroes of the project were Moscow (875 years old), Murom (1160 years old), Kursk (990 years old), Totma (885 years old), Vologda (875 years old), Veliky Ustyug (875 years old), Kostroma (870 years old), and Sergiev Posad (685 years old). Documents from the electronic holdings of the Presidential Library were demonstrated in the exhibition halls: digital copies of archive documents, old maps, and plans.

➔ **“First Buryat Scientist Dorzhi Banzarov”** (November, 2022) – a digital exhibition organized to honour the 200th birth anniversary of Dorzhi Banzarov (1822–1855), the first Buryat scientist who carried out original research in the field of philology, history, and philosophy and made an invaluable contribution into the Russian and world science. The exposition was prepared by specialists of the National Library of the Republic of Buryatia, where a regional center of the Presidential Library operates. The exhibits included letters and documents from the State Archive of the Republic of Buryatia.



➔ **“In the Interests of People, Society, State”** (November, 2022) – a digital exhibition organized to mark the 85th anniversary of the first president of Republic of Sakha (Yakutia) Mikhail Yefimovich Nikolayev. The visitors were able to follow the transformation of the region in the 1990s and early 2000s. This period is remembered in the history of Yakutia as a time of radical change, establishment of the new democratic republic, strengthening of the region’s status as one of the stable and dynamically developing subjects of the Russian Federation. The exhibition was prepared in collaboration with the Library-Archive of the First President of Republic of Sakha (Yakutia) “Nikolayev-Center”, branch of the National Library of Republic of Sakha (Yakutia).

➔ **“My Peter I”** (December, 2022 – January, 2023) – an exhibition of illustrations by the famous St. Petersburg graphic artist Elena Erhardt for the essays of the participants in the contest “My Peter I”, a joint project of the Presidential Library, the All-Russian Literary and Art Magazine for schoolchildren “Kostyor” and the World Club of St. Petersburgers. The exposition is dedicated to contemporaries’ understanding of the most important events in the life of the reformer tsar.



➔ **“The Will of the Peoples of the Union Republics”** (December, 2022 – January, 2023) – an exhibition timed to coincide with the 100th anniversary of the creation of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics. Archival documents and newsreels show visitors how the united union state, which was established on December 30, 1922, developed. At the First All-Union Congress of Soviets, representatives of Russia, Ukraine, Belarus, and the Transcaucasian Federation (Azerbaijan, Armenia, and Georgia) signed the fundamental documents of the new state – the Declaration on the Formation of the USSR and the Union Treaty, which became the main part of the Constitution of 1924. At the exhibition, visitors could get acquainted with the texts of these documents in different languages, as well as learn about the formation of the central authorities of the new state. Among the most interesting exhibits of the exhibition were sketches of the state emblem and banner of the USSR. Various variants of the official state symbols were shown, as well as the emblem and banner approved by the government.



“Viktor Matorin. Images of Russian History in Painting. 21st Century” (November, 2022 – January, 2023) – an exhibition of artworks by the prominent representative of modern realistic art in Russia, who devoted his work to understanding the country’s historical past, important military and political events and their heroes. In the first exhibition hall of the Presidential Library, digital images of the most significant historical paintings of the artist were shown: “The Holy Great Prince of Moscow Dmitry Donskoy”, “Khan Mamai”, “Strike of the Ambush Regiment”, “Battle on the Ice”, “Pugachev’s Execution (Forgive me, Orthodox people!)”, in the second one there were original works dedicated to historical monuments in the royal residence of the 17th century Izmailovo.



Excursions

The main audience of tours of the Presidential Library are students of schools in St. Petersburg and other regions of Russia, students and cadets of secondary specialized and higher educational institutions, residents of St. Petersburg, as well as guests of the city from the regions of Russia and foreign countries. In cooperation with city municipal organizations and social service institutions, excursions were organized for visitors with disabilities, pensioners, veterans of the Great Patriotic War and residents of besieged Leningrad. Excursions around the historical building of the Presidential Library are a traditional part of the cultural program of a large number of public events held annually in the Library's walls. Honored guests and partners of the institution in various areas of activity also got acquainted with the interiors and exhibitions of the Presidential Library in the form of an excursion.

●●●●● In 2022, the Presidential Library was visited by over **8,500** excursionists in more than **400** groups.





Also, work was carried out with individual visitors who, having passed electronic registration on the website or filling out a questionnaire in the Library, attend excursions as groups formed.


 In 2022, the Presidential Library was visited by over **1,000** individual excursionists in more than **40** groups.

Specialists of the Presidential Library’s Excursion Department prepared methodological papers for such excursions, including a technological map and a control excursion text. Practical seminars on excursion activity at exhibition halls of the Library were held for freelance guides.



Multimedia Lessons

Multimedia lessons hold a prominent place among educational projects of the Presidential Library. Their main goal is to develop in students of grades 5–11 an interest in history, law, the Russian language, and literature of our country and to help strengthen the younger generation’s civic consciousness, patriotism, and to form skills in working with unique historical documents from the Library’s holdings. During the lessons, students also get an idea about the effective use of the Internet and how to find necessary and reliable information. Lessons provide significant support to teachers in the educational process and are popular as extracurricular activities.

 In 2022, more than **2,800** schoolchildren from St. Petersburg and the Leningrad Region attended multimedia lessons of the Presidential Library, including:

- “The Lesson of the Constitution”
- “State Symbols of Russia”
- “Russian Truth: The Law of Ancient Russia”
- “The Science of Winning”
- “1825: Thoughts on the Fate of Russia”
- “Hero City Leningrad. 1941–1944”



A new multimedia lesson on the topic “Truly the First. Peter the Great” attracted special interest. The lesson was developed for the celebration of the 350th birth anniversary of Peter I and is designed for high school students. During the lesson, its participants analyze the engraving by Peter Picart of 1717, attributed in the Russian State Historical Archive as “The Coronation of Peter I”, expand their knowledge about the features of the reign of Peter I, the art of engraving and its role during that period, and also gain an understanding of the language of 18th century and symbolism in the fine arts of Peter’s Russia.

A series of lessons “The Origins of St. Petersburg Hospitality: Events, People, Places”, which is held in cooperation with St. Petersburg State University of Economics, continued with topics “Great Transformations of the Great Sovereign”, “Lenexpo – a Significant Place for the Events Industry” and “10 Ideas of What Hospitable St. Petersburg of the Future Will Be”.



Video Lectures “The Knowledge about Russia”

The video lectures cycle “The Knowledge about Russia” continued with the informational support of the Association “Russian Historical Society”.

In 2022, **100** lectures were held within **44** events.

Most of the meetings were dedicated to the anniversaries of outstanding military and statesmen celebrated in 2022 (the 160th birth anniversary of P. A. Stolypin), scientists (205th birth anniversary of N. I. Kostomarov, the 195th birth anniversary of P. P. Semenov-Tyan-Shansky, the 165th birth anniversary of K. E. Tsiolkovsky, the 110th birth anniversary of L. N. Gumilyov), the creative intelligentsia (the 150th birth anniversary of S. P. Diaghilev, the 150th birth anniversary of M. F. Kshesinskaya, the 130th birth anniversary of M. I. Tsvetaeva, the 90th birth anniversary of N. V. Blagovo, the 90th birth anniversary of A. A. Tarkovsky), as well as important dates associated with key events in the history of Russia (the 875th anniversary of the founding of Moscow, the 560th anniversary of the accession of Ivan III to the throne, the 410th anniversary of the end of the Time of Troubles in Russia, the Great Patriotic War, Victory Day). The meetings covered issues of regional history (St. Petersburg and Moscow branches of sacred music,





features of the sculptural decoration of St. Petersburg, the history of Utkina country house), philology, ethnography (the history of the indigenous peoples of the North).

Within the project scientific and practical conference “F. M. Dostoevsky and Present Time” was held, as well as meeting with artist V. Matorin.

In 2022, a two-year cycle of lectures by PhD in Philological Sciences D. A. Bogach “F. M. Dostoevsky: a Conversation about Values”, dedicated to the 200th birth anniversary of F. M. Dostoevsky, finished, as well as a series of lectures “Russian Comics”, revealing the features of this literary genre on the example of the first Soviet comics and comics created in the Kingdom of Yugoslavia.



A series of lectures by PhD in Law Professor V. V. Mamonov “Man, His Rights and Freedoms are the Highest Constitutional Value” dedicated to constitutional rights of citizens to private property, free labor, protection of childhood, motherhood and family, continued, as well as a series of lectures “Outstanding Historians of the 19th–20th Centuries”, organized jointly with the St. Petersburg Institute of History of the Russian Academy of Sciences, whose researchers presented the life path and scientific heritage of their teachers – famous scientists V. M. Paneyakh, V. S. Dyakin, B. V. Ananyich , R. Sh. Ganelin, A. E. Presnyakov, R. G. Skrynnikov.

Of particular interest to the audience were the series of lectures ““You are Immortal, Peter the Great’: On the Occasion of the 350th Birth Anniversary of Peter I” with the participation of experts from “Rodina” magazine, the editors of “Rossiyskaya Gazeta” and authors of articles from the anniversary volume of “Noviy Chasovoy”



magazine, as well as held within the framework of the Forum of Knowledge of the Presidential Library educational events for teachers, methodologists, and students of general educational institutions of St. Petersburg: Pedagogical laboratory “Resources of the Presidential Library as a Source of Knowledge about Peter’s Era”, round table “Video Lectures for Schools. The Epoch of Peter I” and a master class “Student’s Choice of Topics for Research and Design Works”.

The main partners of the Presidential Library in organizing video lectures in the reporting year were St. Petersburg State University, Herzen State Pedagogical University of Russia, St. Petersburg Institute of History of the Russian Academy of Sciences, Pushkin Leningrad State University, State Hermitage, Radio Engineering College of St. Petersburg, St. Petersburg Regional Branch of the Russian Geographical Society, Gorky Ryazan Regional Universal Scientific Library, the History Museum of the Karl May School, V. V. Vinogradov Institute of the Russian Language of the Russian Academy of Sciences, Association of Indigenous Peoples of the North, Siberia, and the Far East of the Russian Federation, St. Petersburg Branch of the “Prosveshchenie” Publishing House, Russian Academy of Natural Sciences, Information and Methodological Center of the Primorsky District of St. Petersburg, Club “Patriot” of the Nevsky district of St. Petersburg, experts from the magazine “Rodina”, the editorial house of the “Rossiyskaya Gazeta” and the magazine “Noviy Chasovoy”, the A. Ya. Vaganova Academy of Russian Ballet, Youth Theater on the Fontanka, K. E. Tsiolkovsky State Museum of History of Cosmonautics, Archive of the Russian Academy of Sciences, South Ural State University, Museum of Cosmonautics in Moscow, Institute of Economics and Entrepreneurship of the Lobachevsky State University of Nizhny Novgorod.



Olympiad “Russia in the Electronic World”

In 2022, the annual Olympiad for schoolchildren “Russia in the Electronic World” was launched for the thirteenth time. It is held in cooperation with the St. Petersburg State Economic University with the support of the Ammosov Northeastern Federal University and Southwest State University. In March, 2022, the third, final round of the 12th Olympiad was held in History, Social Studies, and Russian. It was carried out in **55** regional venues of the Presidential Library in Russia and Mongolia. The majority of finalists represented the Tyumen, Moscow, Chelyabinsk, Nizhniy Novgorod regions, and St. Petersburg. **260** schoolchildren took part in the final round of the Olympiad “Russia in the Electronic World” in 2021–2022 academic year, of which **51** participants became the winners and awardees.

In 2022, the first and the second rounds of the 13th Olympiad were held in History, Social Studies, Russian Language. The qualifying round was attended by **2,775** people from **65** regions of Russia and **3** foreign countries – the Republic of Belarus, Slovakia, and Mongolia. The largest number of participants lives in the Tyumen, Sverdlovsk, and Kemerovo regions. Rounding out the top five are the Kurgan and Novosibirsk regions. **1,234** participants reached the semi-finals of the Olympiad. The final stage





of the 3rd Olympiad in the subject “Russian as a Foreign Language” brought together **308** participants who competed at three levels of proficiency in Russian as a foreign language: elementary (A1), basic (A2), advanced (B1). Participants from Mongolia, Slovakia, Iran, Serbia, India, Kyrgyzstan, Egypt, and China showed themselves most actively. In October 2022, the 4th Olympiad in this subject started, **356** participants registered for its qualifying stage, most of them were citizens of Azerbaijan, Vietnam, Iran, Kazakhstan, Syria, Slovakia, and Uzbekistan.



Thematic Scientific and Practical Conferences

➔ **“A. S. Pushkin Memorial Day at the Presidential Library”** – the conference-webinar became international in 2022. The speakers presented their reports in accordance with the chronology of events in the last year of A. S. Pushkin’s life. Such topics as “Medical Care for Wounded Pushkin” and “Pushkin and Copyright”, current trends in the study of the poet’s life and work, and new resources created in memory of the Russian genius were also covered. Session meetings were held with the participation of the representative of Pushkin’s descendants in Russia and the CIS countries Maarten Bogaerts from Brussels (Belgium) and representatives of the Military Medical Museum of the Ministry of Defense of the Russian Federation (St. Petersburg). The event was attended by representatives of the regional centers of the Presidential Library, who, via video conference, asked questions to the Pushkinist, the head of the Memorial Museum-Apartment of A. S. Pushkin, G. M. Sedova. The film crew of the Presidential Library, together with the All-Russian Museum of A. S. Pushkin, created a video about the last days of A. S. Pushkin’s life “...And Maybe I Will Be Comforted by Love...”.





➔ **“The Cosmonautics Day at the Presidential Library”** combined the meeting with the pilot-cosmonaut Hero of the Russian Federation A. I. Borisenko and the head of the development department of the Engineering and Methodological Company “Education of the Future”, the developer of educational programs, methodological sets and software for schoolchildren in the field of space systems engineering I. V. Ovchinnikov. Long-term cooperation with the North-Western Interregional Public Organization of the Federation of Cosmonautics of Russia and interaction with the regional centers of the Presidential Library to promote thematic electronic collections continued.





➔ **“Virtual Space Flight!”** – a new project (network web quest), organized by the Presidential Library in conjunction with the Northwestern Interregional Public Organization of the Federation of Cosmonautics of Russia and the Penza Regional Center of the Presidential Library. Its goal is to update knowledge related to the development of Russian cosmonautics, by obtaining and consolidating skills in working with electronic resources of the Presidential Library and leading Russian museums of cosmonautics. The project started online on Cosmonautics Day. The event was attended by **124** centers for remote access to the resources of the Presidential Library in **16** regions of the Russian Federation.

➔ **“The Day of Cadet at the Presidential Library”** – a conference dedicated to the 210th anniversary of the Russian victory in the Patriotic War of 1812, covered the most significant historical dates through the prism of the study of the cultural heritage – epic novel by L. N. Tolstoy “War and Peace”.



➔ **“The Day of Arctic at the Presidential Library”** – a conference-webinar held annually to promote knowledge about Arctic expeditions, the original culture of the peoples of the region, the problems of preserving the nature of the Arctic and the subsistence of Arctic communities. As part of the event, an online quiz “Indigenous Peoples of the Arctic” developed by the regional center of the Presidential Library in the Komi Republic was held. Its participants were teams from seven regions of Russia: the Republic of Komi, the Tomsk, Chelyabinsk, Ryazan, Moscow, Sakhalin and Sverdlovsk regions.



➔ **“The Day of Naval Knowledge at the Presidential Library”, “Teachers and Mentors: There Will Be a Russian Fleet!”** – two scientific and educational conferences organized with the support and participation of the N. G. Kuznetsov Naval Academy and JSC “United Shipbuilding Corporation” (JSC USC). The co-organizers were the regional public organization of admirals and generals of the Navy “Admirals Club”, JSC USC, the Admiralty Coordinating Council of public veteran organizations of the Navy. The events were attended by representatives of the administration of St. Petersburg, the Office of the Plenipotentiary Representative of the President of the Russian Federation in the Northwestern Federal District, the General Staff of the Russian Navy, heads of shipyards, research centers and design bureaus. The issues of the formation of Russia’s technological sovereignty in shipbuilding, the prospects for the development of a network of children’s maritime associations and specialized classes, the history of the creation of the Russian Navy and its role in the history of the country, the history of the development of the Arctic Ocean and the discovery of the coast of Alaska were discussed. Documentary chronicles of the Great Patriotic War were presented, as well as maritime youth projects, new multimedia technologies used in museum, exhibition and educational activities.





“Law and Information: The Questions of Theory and Practice” – the XII Annual International Scientific and Practical Conference with the participation of representatives from various regions of Russia and neighboring states, with the majority of attendees taking part via videoconferencing mode. Presentations were made by representatives of leading scientific institutions, legal educational organizations of higher education, as well as law faculties: the Institute of State and Law of the Russian Academy of Sciences, the Institute of Legislation and Comparative Law under the Government of the Russian Federation, the Russian Presidential Academy of National Economy and Public Administration, Moscow and Ural law universities, St. Petersburg State University, and libraries. By tradition, the conference was attended by employees of organizations dealing with practical problems of legal informatization and information: the Scientific Center for Legal Information under the Ministry of Justice of the Russian Federation and the National Center for Legal Information of the Republic of Belarus, practicing lawyers and organizers of legal education.

➔ **“Keep the Truth About War: Chronicles of War at Sea”** – an online conference dedicated to the 325th anniversary of the establishment of the regular Russian Navy and the 80th anniversary of the start of the Great Patriotic War “The Role of the People’s Commissariat of the Navy of the USSR and N. G. Kuznetsov in the Initial Period of the Great Patriotic War: June 22 – December 31, 1941”, prepared by the regional public organization of admirals and generals of the Russian Navy “Admirals Club” with the support of the Presidential Library.



➔ **“The Annual Integration Forum of the Presidential Library”** – in 2022, the Presidential Library in St. Petersburg and the State Scientific Library of Kuzbass named after V. D. Fyodorov in Kemerovo were chosen as venues for a set of events. The Forum is traditionally supported by the Federal Archive Agency, the Union of Museums of Russia, the Russian Library Association, the Ministry of Culture of the Kemerovo Region. The program of the Forum included the XIII Scientific and Practical Conference “Cultural Heritage: Resource Integration in the Digital Environment”; an off-site meeting of the heads of the regional centers of the Presidential Library, which was attended by **59** people from **27** constituent entities of the Russian Federation, including via videoconferencing; thematic events “Digital Cultural Heritage: Preservation and Optimization of Access” and “Training Library Specialists in the Context of Digitalization”. The opening of a remote electronic reading room of the Presidential Library on the basis of the museum-reserve “Tomskaya Pisanitsa” in the Kemerovo region took place. Four round tables were held for librarians and researchers with reports by **13** scientists, including on the topic “Social and Economic Development of Russia in the 18th Century: On the Occasion of the 350th Birth Anniversary of Peter I”.

Cinema Club

The Presidential Library's cinema club is an open site for screening and discussion of the best non-fiction movies on the history of Russia. Programs of the cinema club meetings get the audience acquainted not only with the classics of documentary, but also with works of young cinematographers, who look at significant historical and cultural issues of development of Russia.

 In 2022, **22** meetings of the cinema club took place.

The heroic pages of the history of the Great Patriotic War are the key theme of the cinema club. Together with the Union of Writers of St. Petersburg, works from the project “Dedicated to the Liberation of Leningrad...” were presented: “Maruska” (directed by V. Arno), “For Kefir” (directed by S. Fedosov) and “Wolves of the Siege” (directed by S. Kuleshova). The film “Ship-Boys from the Island of Valaam” was created by the Presidential Library in conjunction with the Regional Museum of the Northern Ladoga Region and dedicated to the feat of the Valaam young ship-boys who gave their lives in bloody battles for the Nevsky bridgehead and the crossing of Ladoga along the Road of Life. On the 80th anniversary of the Staro-Panovskaya military operation, the film “With a Prayer for the Fallen” (directed by T. Dyakonova) about the memorial church of the holy martyrs Adrian and Natalia dedicated to the dead and missing during the defense of Leningrad in 1942 was shown. To mark 125th birth anniversary of the outstanding Marshal of the Soviet Union K. A. Meretskov, the film “Unfinished Memoirs” (directed by P. Medvedev) was shown.





The search for the burial places of the defenders of the Fatherland – the victims of the Tallinn crossing (1941), who died in 1942 as a result of the battles for the island of Gogland under the command of the legendary Colonel A. A. Barinov is the main focus of the film “Islands of Memory” (directed by K. Korolev). Representatives of the Search Movement of Russia, the Presidential Foundation for Cultural Initiatives and the Russian Geographical Society took part in the screening and discussion of the film.

The theme of the memory of the defenders of Leningrad during the years of the siege is also heard in the film “A Tram Goes to the Front” (directed by A. Egorov), which tells about the role of the tram in the life of the Leningraders under the siege.

At the meetings of the cinema club, films dedicated to the nature, history, and culture of St. Petersburg and the Leningrad Region, the Northwestern Region, including “Staraya Ladoga. The Cradle of Life” (directed by A. Ivushkin), “Keepers. My Leningrad Region” (directed by A. Bar) were shown. B. Dedenev’s film project “Three in a Boat” was presented. The pre-premiere screening of the film “The Northerners” (directed by K. Okhapkina), created with the support of the Presidential Foundation for Cultural Initiatives, was dedicated to the traditions and culture of the Vologda land.





As part of the cultural program of the XXV St. Petersburg International Economic Forum, with Egypt as its guest country, the film “Chronicles of the Nubian Expedition” (directed by D. Zavilgelsky) about the first archaeological expedition of the USSR Academy of Sciences in 1961–1963 was shown.

The continuation of the section “Masters of Russian Cinema” was the screening of the film “Maslennikov. Is There Life after Sherlock Holmes?” (directed by V. Balayan), dedicated to the 90th anniversary of the People’s Artist of the RSFSR, director I. F. Maslennikov.

Two meetings of the cinema club took place within the framework of the project “St. Petersburg Open Screening of Creative Works ‘Ekranizatsiia’” (Film Adaptation). One of them was dedicated to the topic “Music in the Cinema”, in particular, to the work of the composer, conductor, author of music for more than 80 feature and documentary films V. V. Panchenko, which featured music performed by the Admiralty Orchestra

of the Leningrad Naval Base. The second was marked by the screening of the film “To Magnify the Russian Word” dedicated to the history of the Russian Academy of Sciences (directed by K. Artyukhov).

The environmental theme was touched upon by the film “The Wasp Waist of the White Sea Ecosystem” (directed by P. Glazkov and D. Laius), created with the support of the project “Three-Spined Stickleback as a Key Component of the White Sea Ecosystem”.





Children’s multimedia creative works were presented in 2022 with a screening and discussion of film works by the finalists of the media projects competition of the V International Festival of Children’s and Youth Creative Works, dedicated to the image of Peter the Great in poetry and the author’s song of the 20th–21st centuries. The organizers of the festival are the Alexander Gorodnitsky Foundation for the Development and Popularization of Poetry and Author’s Song and the All-Russian Museum of A. S. Pushkin.

Within the scope of the traditional “Multimedia Festival” of the Presidential Library, multimedia works by students of the cinema studios “Paradise” of the Teenagers and Youth Club “Mayak”, the film studio “Dynamics”, and the School of Young Professionals “M-Art” of the Center for Creative Development and Humanitarian Education of Children “On Vasilyevsky” were screened.

The youth branch of the cinema club was represented by films of graduates of the Higher School of Film Directors and Screenwriters of the “Lenfilm” Studio. The film “Songs of the Baltic Slavs” (directed by R. Ushakov), based on historical documents, conversations with scientists, filming in museums, and materials from archaeological excavations, spoke about the role of the Slavs in the formation of the statehood of Ancient Rus’.

The cycle of documentaries directed by A. Bar “The Soul of Dance”: “Bashkir Dance”, “Ingush Lezginka” and “Russian Dance” is dedicated to the dance culture of the peoples of Russia and its closest neighbors. Its screening was timed to coincide with the Year of Folk Art and Intangible Cultural Heritage of the Peoples of Russia.



Other Events and Projects



➔ **The concert for guests and participants of the XXV St. Petersburg International Economic Forum** was held with the participation of the State Kremlin Orchestra of the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation. Honored artists of Russia, soloists of the country's leading theaters performed arias from the works of Russian and foreign composers, united by the theme of Russian statehood, the history of our country. The director for special projects of the Kremlin Orchestra, opera singer V. V. Kononova, led the concert and performed one of the numbers.



➔ The gala concert of graduates of the Department of Solo Singing of the St. Petersburg State Conservatory named after N. A. Rimsky-Korsakov became a gift for the International Women’s Day from the best graduates of the Conservatory for their tutors, relatives, and staff of the Presidential Library.



➔ The solemn event dedicated to the celebration of Victory Day for veterans of the Great Patriotic War, and a concert dedicated to the Day of National Unity and the 318th anniversary of founding of the Admiralteisky district of St. Petersburg were held in cooperation with the St. Petersburg State Institute of Culture.

➔ A presentation of a new book by one of the authors of the current Constitution of the Russian Federation, Doctor of Law, Professor, Honored Lawyer of the Russian Federation S. M. Shakhrai “How I Wrote the Constitution of the Era of Yeltsin and Putin”, in which he shares the history of the creation of the Russian Constitution in the critical 1990s, took place.

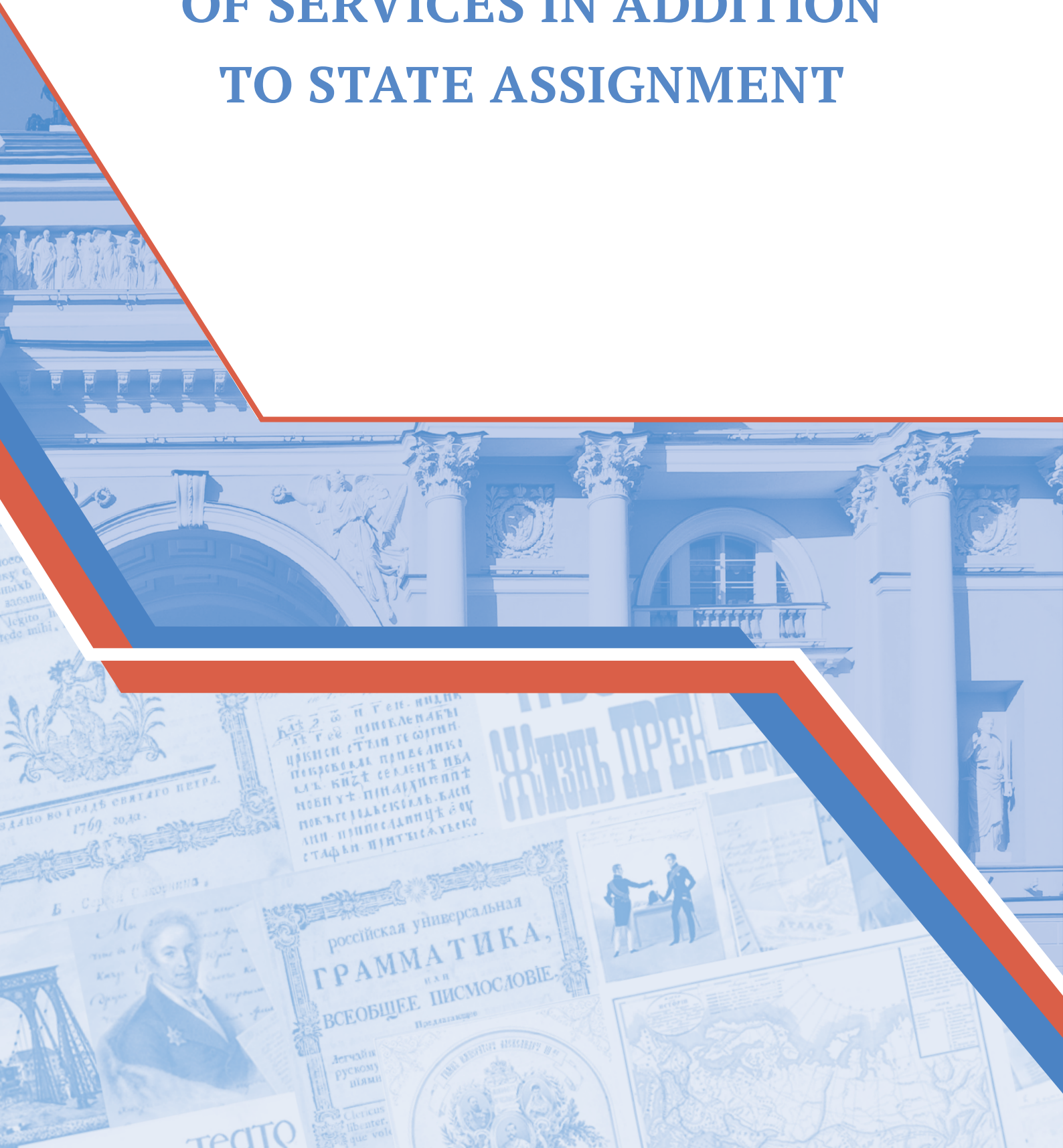




➔ **Contests for the network of libraries of the constituent entities of the Russian Federation**, on the basis of which the regional centers of the Presidential Library operate, were held in 2022 on the topics “Region: Golden Holdings of the Intangible Cultural Heritage” and “Best Regional Practices of Organizational and Methodological Support of Centers for Remote Access to the Resources of the Presidential Library”. The first competition was won by the Novosibirsk State Regional Scientific Library, the second was won by the V. Ya. Shishkov Altai Territorial Universal Scientific Library (in the nomination “The Best Programs/Manuals for the Organizational and Methodological Support of the Centers for Remote Access”), the M. Gorky Ryazan Regional Universal Scientific Library (in the nomination “The Best Manuals for Organizing the Use/Promotion of the Electronic Holdings of the Presidential Library”), the State Scientific Library of Kuzbass named after V. D. Fedorov (in the nomination “The Best Methodological Measures for Specialists of the Centers for Remote Access”), the State Library of Yugra (in the nomination “Cultural Initiative of the Methodologist. The Best Network Projects of the Regional Centers of the Presidential Library”). Based on the results of the second competition, a collection of guidance papers was published.

➔ In 2022, the Presidential Library held the **competition of student works (projects) using the information resources of the Presidential Library**, which is mandatory for the participants, for the third time. The results were summed up in three nominations: “Best Course Work”, “Best Final Qualifying Work and/or Thesis”, and “Best Research Work”. On November 11, 2022, during the opening of the XII International Scientific and Practical Conference “Law and Information: the Questions of Theory and Practice” diplomas of various degrees were awarded to **11** participants of the competition from Moscow, St. Petersburg, and Ufa.

EXECUTION OF WORKS AND PROVISION OF SERVICES IN ADDITION TO STATE ASSIGNMENT



INFORMATION, ORGANIZATIONAL, AND TECHNOLOGICAL SUPPORT OF MAJOR SOCIAL AND POLITICAL EVENTS

In 2022, the Presidential Library repeatedly became a venue for major social and political events.



➔ It housed in St. Petersburg the regular **Informal Summit of States-Members of the Commonwealth of Independent States** attended by the President of the Russian Federation Vladimir Putin, President of the Republic of Azerbaijan Ilham Aliyev, Prime Minister of the Republic of Armenia Nikol Pashinyan, President of the Republic of Belarus Alexander Lukashenko, President of the Republic of Kazakhstan Kassym-Jomart Tokayev, President of the Kyrgyz Republic Sadyr Japarov, President of the Republic of Tajikistan Emomali Rahmon, President of the Republic of Turkmenistan Serdar Berdimuhamedov, and President of the Republic of Uzbekistan Shavkat Mirziyoyev.



On December 26, the leaders of nine states summed up the work of the Commonwealth of Independent States in 2022, discussed plans for the future and issues of concern to everyone on the regional and international agenda. V. V. Putin also noted that “a powerful unifying force that holds our multinational states together” is the Russian language.

➔ The annual International Technology Forum “**Russian Week of Standardization**” was timed to coincide with the World Standards Day. Heads and representatives of federal authorities, international and foreign standardization organizations, major research and educational centers, Russian industrial enterprises discussed the main theme of this year’s forum – standardization for technological development, including a number of key issues such as standards for the digital industry, rebooting the national certification system, standardization and sustainable development, the practice of applying international and national standards in the field of management systems, standardization of alternative plant-based food products, etc.

➔ The All-Russian Scientific and Practical Conference with international participation “**Actual Issues of Hematology and Transfusiology**” was dedicated to the 90th anniversary of the Russian Research Institute of Hematology and Transfusiology.





➔ **III International Scientific and Practical Conference on Combating the New Coronavirus Infection and Other Infectious Diseases** brought together about 300 high-level delegates from ministries and departments responsible for the prevention and control of infectious diseases, the countries of the Commonwealth of Independent States, Eastern Europe, Central Asia, Africa, Southeast Asia, as well as relevant international, non-governmental and scientific organizations. The participants



of the event continued to share their experience in combating the new coronavirus infection with colleagues. The conference was held under the patronage of the head of the Federal Service for Supervision of Consumer Rights Protection and Human Welfare – Chief State Sanitary Doctor of the Russian Federation A. Yu. Popova.



➔ **The VI International Nevsky Forum “Reforms in Russia: From Peter the Great to the Present Day”** was organized by the North-West Institute of Management of the Russian Presidential Academy of National Economy and Public Administration. Well-known politicians, public figures, entrepreneurs, public administration experts, and leading scientists from Russia, Belarus, Kyrgyzstan, Serbia, Brazil, Uruguay, the People’s Republic of China, Thailand, and other countries took part in the discussions. The experts discussed ideas for the development of Russian economic sectors under sanctions, proposals for a communication strategy for Russia, future reforms as a response to modern challenges and threats, improving the quality of public administration, as well as the special role of the business community in the conditions of economic pressure.





➔ The fifth conference **“The Constitution of Russia Yesterday, Today, Tomorrow”** was traditionally timed to coincide to the International Human Rights Day (December 10) and the Day of the Constitution of Russia (December 12) by its organizers – St. Petersburg University of Management Technologies and Economics and the Foundation “Respublika”.

➔ The Pedagogical Council of the Admiralteisky district on the topic **“Strategic Guidelines and Value Meanings of Modern Education”** was held on the eve of the Knowledge Day. Representatives of the district’s pedagogical community, with the participation and support of members of the Government of St. Petersburg, discussed the tasks for the new academic year.





INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITIES

➔ **Cooperation with the Syrian Arab Republic.** In 2022, as part of the development of international cooperation, Memorandums of Understanding in the field of cultural cooperation were signed with the Al-Assad National Library and a Memorandum of Understanding with Damascus University.



On the territory of the Syrian Arab Republic, on the basis of the Russian Center for Science and Culture in Damascus, with the direct participation of the Deputy Chief Executive Officer of the President of the Russian Federation O. Yu. Lyakina, a center for remote access to the resources of the Presidential Library was opened. Specialists





of the Presidential Library made presentations at the scientific and practical conference “Russia – Syria: Cultural and Educational Foundations of Cooperation”, and the prize-winner of the Olympiad of the Presidential Library “Russia in the Electronic World” in the subject “Russian as a Foreign Language” from the Syrian Arab Republic was also awarded.

The Russian House in Damascus hosted a presentation “The Presidential Library: Preserving Cultural Heritage in the Digital Environment” (including a demonstration of the Presidential Library’s digital collection “Russia – Syria: From the History of Relations”) with an Arabic translation. Employees of the Presidential Library prepared and held the ceremony of opening and transfer to the Ministry of Culture of Syria of the Presidential Library’s tablet exhibition “Introduction to the Russian Federation: World Heritage on the Map of Russia”.

➔ Being a participant of the **XXV St. Petersburg International Economic Forum**, the Presidential Library concluded cooperation agreements with:

- with the Plenipotentiary Representative of the President of the Russian Federation in the Urals Federal District;
- with the National Research University “Higher School of Economics”;
- with the National Institute for Research and Development of projects in the field of cross-national, interreligious, interethnic, intercultural, and cross-country communications.



License agreements were signed with:

- LLC “Gazprom Transgas Moscow” in the presence of the plenipotentiary representative of the President of the Russian Federation in the Central Federal District



I. O. Schegolev on the transfer of rights to post the photo album “S. M. Prokudin-Gorsky. Central Russia” in the Presidential Library’s holdings (photos from the Library’s holdings were used to create the photo album);

– with the author of the book “Nuclear Management of the USSR”, Chairman of the Board of Directors of JSC “LOESK” A. A. Sizov (the gift edition was donated to the Presidential Library).

➡ The Presidential Library took part in the **VII Eastern Economic Forum** (EEF 2022). On the eve of the forum, a new electronic collection “Far East: Point of Attraction” was prepared, containing digital copies of more than 1,5 thousand documents that tell about the history, economy, science, culture of each of the 11 constituent territories of the Far Eastern Federal District and reveal the role of the region in the international political and economic systems: archive materials, traveler research, photographs, maps. A separate section is dedicated to international relations with the countries of the Asia-Pacific region. A video about the collection was shown at the stand of the Primorsky Territory.

On the margins of the EEF 2022, cooperation agreements were signed with the Ministry of Culture and Archive Affairs of the Primorsky Territory, the Ministry



of Education of the Primorsky Territory, the Far Eastern Federal University, five model libraries of the Primorsky Territory (at the site of the Central Library named after A. P. Chekhov of the Vladivostok Centralized Library System), the Primorsky Territorial Institute for the Development of Education.

In 2022, centers for remote access to the resources of the Presidential Library were opened on the basis of Gymnasium No. 1 in Vladivostok and the Primorsky Territorial Institute for the Development of Education. At the site of the latter, a seminar “The Potential of Information Resources of the Presidential Library” was held for specialists in the education and culture system of the Primorsky Territory.





➤ **The ceremony of signing the Cooperation Agreement between the Presidential Library and the Shenzhen MSU-BIT University** took place via videoconferencing. Director General of the Presidential Library Yu. S. Nosov and Rector of the Shenzhen MSU-BIT University in Li Hezhang signed the agreement that defines the areas of cooperation: holding joint scientific and cultural projects, organizing joint conferences and training events, the exchange of electronic documents of a historical and cultural nature, the creation of access points to information resources of both parties. The ceremony was moderated by the First Vice-Rector, Chairman of the Academic Council of the Shenzhen MSU-BIT University S. M. Shakhrai.





➔ In 2022, a preliminary agreement to establish **the Association of the Presidential Libraries** was reached between the presidential libraries of four countries: Azerbaijan, Belarus, Kazakhstan, and Russia. This initiative of the Presidential Library was supported by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Russian Federation and the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation. As part of the work of the Association, it is planned to share experience and resources, to hold joint events. One of the important aims is to provide citizens of the participating countries with wide access to world cultural values.





CULTURAL AND SOCIAL EVENTS



➔ The gala concert “**Gifted Children of Russia**” followed by results of the Open All-Russian competition of vocal and instrumental art for the Prize of the Cultural Center of Elena Obraztsova that traditionally was held within the walls of the Presidential Library. The director for special projects of the State Kremlin Orchestra V. V. Kononova had presented diplomas of the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation to young talented musicians – participants of the Competition.

➔ **Baltic Charity Ball** dedicated to the World Day of Music was hosted for the first time by the Presidential Library with the support of the Committee of Culture of St. Petersburg. This event not only gave the guests unforgettable emotions from the performance of works by famous Russian, French, Italian, and Austrian composers by the musicians of the St. Petersburg State Academic Symphony Orchestra, but also made it possible to raise funds to help the wards of the “Life Line” charity foundation for saving severely ill children.





➔ **The memorial tournament in memory of Professor of St. Petersburg State University of Economics, International Chess Master Igor Yakovlevich Blekhtsin** for the second time gathered in the Presidential Library more than 130 chess players from St. Petersburg, the Leningrad Region, Pskov, and other cities of the Northwestern Federal District.

➔ **The V National scientific and methodological conference with international participation “Architecture of University Education: Strategic Directions of Transformation and New Models of Development”** was organized in cooperation with the St. Petersburg State University of Economics with the support of the Ministry of Science and Education of the Russian Federation. In 2022, the conference covered the issues of the formation of new approaches to the strategic development of university ecosystems in the current reality.





PUBLISHING AND PRINTING ACTIVITIES

In 2022, the Presidential Library prepared and published next issues of its scientific collections “Studia Historico-Juridica”, “Digital Archive”, “Digital Library”, and “Electronic Legislation”.

The scientific and practical manual “RUSMARC in Examples. Archive Materials in the Library Catalog”, prepared on the basis of theoretical research and practical activities of the Presidential Library in the field of the formation of an integrated library catalog, as well as the collection “Best Regional Practices of Organizational and Methodological Support of Centers for Remote Access to the Resources of the Presidential Library”, which summarizes the results of the Presidential Library’s contest under same name, were published.



Publishing and printing work was carried out to prepare the exhibition project “Introduction to the Russian Federation: World Heritage on the Map of Russia”, which was demonstrated in the Syrian Arab Republic. Photographs, copies of old engravings, geographical maps, book illustrations, postcards from the electronic collection of the Presidential Library, accompanied by explanatory texts in Russian and Arabic, were placed on 20 large-format tablets. Thematic booklets about the Presidential Library in Russian and Arabic were prepared for the guests of the exhibition in Syria.





Publishing and printing products of the Presidential Library were presented at the XVII St. Petersburg International Book Fair, held on Dvortsovaya (Palace) Square.



In 2022, the publishing and printing complex of the Presidential Library prepared **136** titles of publishing products with a total circulation of **17,250** copies, of which **17** titles with a total circulation of **1,237** copies were ordered as part of the execution of contracts for income-generating activities.





PROVISION OF PAID SERVICES TO LEGAL ENTITIES AND INDIVIDUALS

In 2022, on the basis of a license for educational activities dated July 17, 2019, No. 3886, the Presidential Library, on a paid basis, conducted training in two additional professional advanced training programs: “Developing Reader Interest in Poetry Among Library Users” (16 academic hours) and “Pedagogical Approaches and Methods in Library and Information Servicing” (16 academic hours). The training was carried out in full-time mode using remote educational technologies.

27 library specialists and teachers from the Altai Territory, the Belgorod Region, Kirov, the Kursk Region, the Leningrad Region, the Novgorod Region, the Republic of Karelia, the Republic of Altai, the Republic of Sakha (Yakutia), the Republic of Tyva, the Sverdlovsk region, the Tomsk Region, the Khanty-Mansiysk Autonomous District – Yugra, Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk successfully mastered additional professional training programs and received the certificates of advanced training.



PRESIDENTIAL LIBRARY IN MASS MEDIA



In 2022, work on getting the public acquainted with the Presidential Library's activity continued.

For many years, the institution has cooperated with a variety of mass media. These include information agencies: TASS and "Interfax", the International Information Agency "MIR", "Russia-Online – News of Russia Today", "IMA-Press", Regnum, Federalcity, "Nevskie Novosti", television channels: First Channel, All-Russian State Television and Radio Broadcasting Company, RT, NTV, RenTV, "MIR", "Star", RBC, 5th Channel, 78, "St. Petersburg", "LenTV24", as well as radio stations: "Radio Petersburg", "Radio of Russia – St. Petersburg", Business FM, and others.

Publications about the Presidential Library are published in such print and online media as "Rossiyskaya Gazeta", "Izvestia", "Literaturnaya Gazeta", "Krasnaya Zvezda", "Komsomolskaya Pravda", "Moskovskiy Komsomolets", "Moskovskaya Pravda", "Peterburgsky Dnevnik", "St. Petersburg Vedomosti", "Evening St. Petersburg", "General Newspaper of the Leningrad Region", "Vremya", "Rural Life", as well as on the news and reference websites "Russia-Online – News of RUSSIA Today", "Public News Service", "Culture of St. Petersburg", "City+", Online47, "ProConference.RF", "GlavSprav", etc.

Information about the activities of the Presidential Library is also posted on the official website of the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation, the Internet resources of the Ministry of Culture and the Ministry of Defense of the Russian Federation, the Executive Committee of the Commonwealth of Independent States, the Russian Historical Society, the Federal Archive Agency (Rosarchiv), the Russian State Military Archive, Rossotrudnichestvo and its representative offices in different countries of the world, the Presidential Foundation for Cultural Initiatives, the Russian Library Association, the administrations of St. Petersburg, the Leningrad Region, and other regions, the Moscow Patriarchy, the St. Petersburg Metropolis, the Tikhvin and other dioceses of the Russian Orthodox Church, as well as on the federal website "Russian Education".



The Presidential Library is also widely represented in social media VKontakte, RuTube, Telegram messenger. Work on posting information about the Library's activities on the page of the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation is carried out as well.

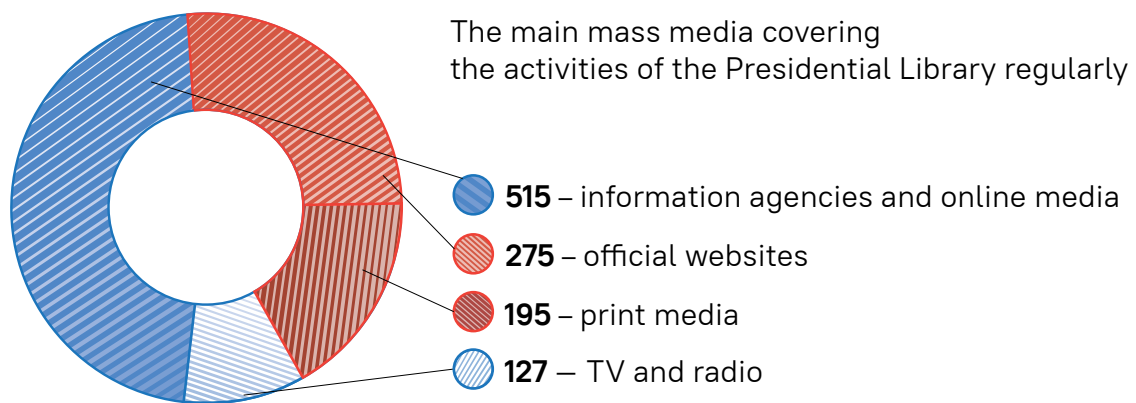
The Presidential Library cooperates with mass media actively, hosts joint exhibitions and events.

Fruitful cooperation with the newspaper "Peterburgsky Dnevnik" continued. In June, as part of the cultural program of the anniversary XXV St. Petersburg International Economic Forum, the Presidential Library hosted a presentation and discussion of the interregional tourist video project "The Silver Necklace of Russia" with films about St. Petersburg and the Leningrad Region, created by the employees of "Peterburgsky Dnevnik". In the year of the celebration of the 350th birth anniversary of Peter I, the pages of "Peterburgsky Dnevnik", the official media of the Government of St. Petersburg, monthly published materials prepared by the press service of the Presidential Library on the life and work of Peter the Great.



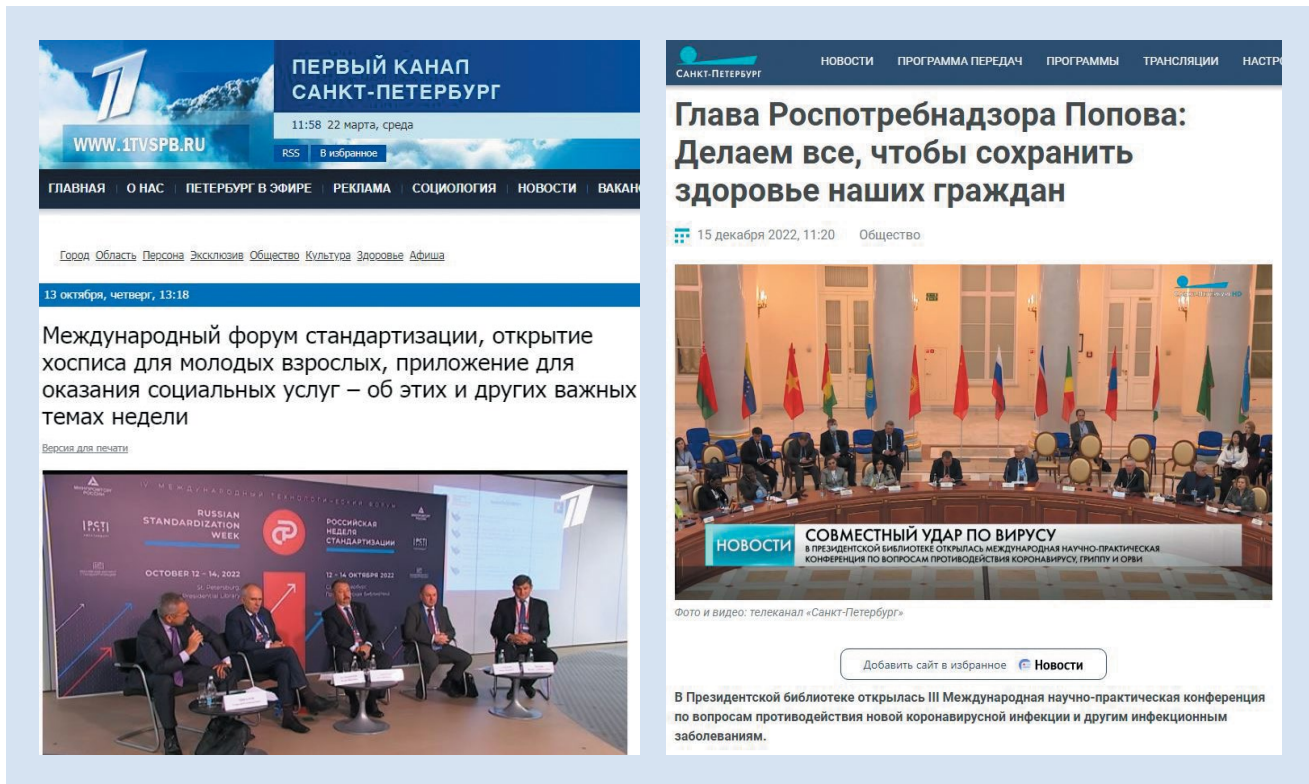
The celebration of the 350th birth anniversary of Peter I, which was in the center of media attention in 2022, gave a new impetus to the cooperation of the Presidential Library with the All-Russian literary and art magazine for schoolchildren “Kostyor”. In January, the essay contest for schoolchildren “My Peter I” started, and in December, the winners and laureates were awarded in a solemn atmosphere. This was a joint project of the Library, the All-Russian magazine for schoolchildren “Kostyor” and the World Club of Petersburgers. About **1,000** schoolchildren wrote creative works about Peter I on the basis of the Presidential Library’s holdings. The competition was aimed at popularizing the Presidential Library’s holdings among the younger generation.

Also, a series of events dedicated to Peter I was held jointly with the military history magazine “Noviy Chasovoy”.



Cooperation of the Presidential Library with editorial offices of “Radio Petersburg” (program “Petersburg Regional Ethnographers”) and “Radio of Russia – St. Petersburg” (section “Historical Facts from the Presidential Library”) continued in 2022. Employees of the Library told daily about activities of well-known writers, scientists, public figures, anniversary dates of the year through the prism of materials from the Presidential Library’s holdings, as well as about exhibitions launched in the building on Senatskaya Square, 3.

Throughout the year, materials prepared on the basis of the calendar of significant and memorable dates, as well as those telling about new collections of the Presidential Library, were published on the website and sent to the media. The attention of the mass media was attracted by publications dedicated to the anniversary events: 350th birth anniversary of Peter the Great, 410th anniversary of the liberation of Moscow from the Polish interventionists by the people’s militia, 300th anniversary of the formation of the prosecutor’s office, 265th anniversary of the founding of the Imperial Academy of Arts, 245th birth anniversary of Emperor Alexander I, 210th anniversary



of the battle of Borodino, 195th birth anniversary of A. K. Tolstoy, 165th birth anniversary of K. E. Tsiolkovsky, 150th birth anniversary of M. F. Kshesinskaya, 105th anniversary of the October Revolution, 80th anniversary of the first performance of the famous Seventh Symphony by D. D. Shostakovich in besieged Leningrad, and others.

During the year, information support was provided for international and Russian conferences, forums, webinars, video lectures, film screenings, and virtual tours available on the institution's website, multimedia and tablet exhibitions launched at the Presidential Library.


Special attention was paid to informing the audience about the Olympiad "Russia in the Electronic World" carried out by the Presidential Library in History, Social Studies and Russian, as well as in the subject "Russian as a Foreign Language", and the contest of student's works.

From September 1, 2022, a 24-hour television channel began to work on the Presidential Library's website. The broadcast schedule was dedicated to memorable and significant dates and major events at the Presidential Library. Information support of Internet broadcasting, preparation and distribution of announcements of broadcasts to the media was carried out. Users were particularly interested in the announcements of new videos of the Presidential Library: "Rescued Frescoes. Church of St. Nicholas on Lipna", "Memorial Library of M. S. Vorontsov: What is Hidden Behind the Spines of the Books

of the Vorontsov Palace”, video recordings of a concert held at Senatskaya square, 3, with the participation of the State Kremlin Orchestra of the Department of Affairs of the President of the Russian Federation, etc.

Detailed information about the publications on the activities of the Presidential Library can be found in the weekly digest, which is available in the electronic reading room of the Presidential Library, as well as in remote access centers in the Russian Federation and abroad.

The most striking and significant publications are posted on the website of the Presidential Library in the “Mass Media” section.
